

- Ground-floor accommodation comprises hall, cloaks, lounge, kitchen.








Cloak as a Verb

- Cover as if with clothing.
- Cover with or as if with a cloak.
- Dress in a cloak.

He wasn t able to **veil** his disappointment.








Usage Examples of "Cloak" as a verb
