| ball | In soccer a pass of the ball in a specified direction or manner. <i>His half century came off only forty balls.</i> |
| blockhead | A stupid person. |
| buffoon | A person who amuses others by ridiculous behavior. |
| <u>chunk</u> | A significant amount of something. <i>We won a chunk of money.</i> |
| clump | A heavy dull sound (as made by impact of heavy objects). <i>Clumps of earth.</i> |
| dolt | A person who is not very bright. |
| dullard | A slow or stupid person. <i>He was caricatured as a dupe and a dullard.</i> |

| dunce | A stupid person; these words are used to express a low opinion of someone's intelligence. <i>He was baffled by arithmetic and they called him a dunce at school.</i> |
| fool | A jester or clown, especially one retained in a royal or noble household. <i>He is the fool of circumstances.</i> |
| <u>gawk</u> | An awkward stupid person. <i>Let those country gawks dance to their hearts content.</i> |
| glob | A compact mass. <i>Thick globs of mozzarella cheese.</i> |
| goon | An awkward stupid person. <i>He hired goons to hunt down supporters.</i> |
| halfwit | A foolish or stupid person. <i>Worst of all were the halfwits in the background guffawing at every pathetic gag.</i> |
| hunk | A well-built sexually attractive man. <i>A hunk of bread.</i> |
| idiot | A person of low intelligence. |
| ignoramus | An ignorant person. <i>Assume that your examiner is an ignoramus and explain everything to him.</i> |
| imbecile | A person of subnormal intelligence. |
| lout | An awkward stupid person. <i>Drunken louts.</i> |
| lubber | An inexperienced sailor; a sailor on the first voyage. |
| lummoX | An awkward stupid person. <i>Watch it you great lummoX.</i> |
| <u>lump</u> | The state of being self-employed and paid without deduction of tax, especially in the building industry. <i>Lump labour.</i> |
| <u>mass</u> | (Roman Catholic Church and Protestant Churches) the celebration of the Eucharist. <i>The masterly distribution of masses.</i> |
| nincompoop | A foolish or stupid person. |
| oaf | An awkward stupid person. <i>They are just big clumsy oafs.</i> |
| piece | A king, queen, bishop, knight, or rook, as opposed to a pawn. <i>The children acted out a comic piece to amuse the guests.</i> |

simpleton A person lacking intelligence or common sense.
*Stop grinning at me like a **simpleton**.*

slab A large, smooth body of rock lying at a sharp angle to the horizontal.
*A fishmonger's **slab**.*

stumblebum A clumsy or inept person.

wedge A heel on a wedge shoe.
*A **wedge** of cheese.*



Usage Examples of "Clod" as a noun

- *You're an insensitive clod and I hope you fall and break your neck.*
- *Other stewing cuts (in England known to the meat trade as clod) may cook in 90 minutes.*
- *Frost is essential for breaking up clods into manageable sizes.*
