## Associations of "Closed off" (30 Words)

<b>abolish</b>	Formally put an end to (a system, practice, or institution). <i>Slavery was <b>abolished</b> in the mid 19th century in America and in Russia.</i>
<b>abrogate</b>	Evade (a responsibility or duty). <i>A proposal to <b>abrogate</b> temporarily the right to strike.</i>
<b>abrogation</b>	The repeal or abolition of a law, right, or agreement.
<b>annul</b>	Declare invalid (an official agreement, decision, or result). <i>Her first marriage was finally <b>annulled</b> by His Holiness.</i>
<b>barred</b>	Marked with stripes or bands. <i>A <b>barred</b> gate.</i>
<b>blocked</b>	Closed to traffic. <i>A <b>blocked</b> nose.</i>
<a href="#"><b>cancel</b></a>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>His visa had been <b>cancelled</b>.</i>
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<a href="#"><b>delete</b></a>	Remove (a product, especially a recording) from the catalogue of those available for purchase. <i>Their EMI release has already been <b>deleted</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>exterminate</b></a>	Kill en masse; kill on a large scale; kill many. <i>They use poison to <b>exterminate</b> moles.</i>
<b>immobile</b>	Not capable of movement or of being moved. <i>An <b>immobile</b> workforce.</i>
<a href="#"><b>invalidate</b></a>	Deprive (an official document or procedure) of legal validity because it contravenes a regulation or law. <i><b>Invalidate</b> a contract.</i>

<b>naught</b>	The digit 0; nought. <i>All my efforts led to <b>naught</b>.</i>
<b>nil</b>	A quantity of no importance. <i>They beat us three <b>nil</b>.</i>
<b>none</b>	Not at all or in no way. <i>Thou shalt have <b>none</b> other gods before me.</i>
<b>nothing</b>	Not at all. <i>It looked like <b>nothing</b> I had ever seen before.</i>
<b>nowhere</b>	Having no prospect of progress or success. <i>He came out of <b>nowhere</b>.</i>
<b>null</b>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i><b>Null</b> and void.</i>
<b>nullify</b>	Show to be invalid. <i>Judges were unwilling to <b>nullify</b> government decisions.</i>
<b>obstructed</b>	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. <i>Justice <b>obstructed</b> is not justice.</i>
<b>occluded</b>	(of a substance) taken into and retained in another substance. <i>An <b>occluded</b> artery.</i>
<b>override</b>	Be more important than. <i>The House vote in favour of the bill was 10 votes short of the requisite majority for an <b>override</b>.</i>
<b>rescind</b>	Revoke, cancel, or repeal (a law, order, or agreement). <i>The government eventually <b>rescinded</b> the directive.</i>
<b>stuffy</b>	Excessively conventional and unimaginative and hence dull. <i>He was steady and rather <b>stuffy</b>.</i>
<b>suspend</b>	Cause to be held in suspension in a fluid. <i>Work on the dam was <b>suspended</b>.</i>
<b>transience</b>	The state or fact of lasting only for a short time; transitoriness. <i>The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.</i>
<b>uncharacteristically</b>	In a way that is not typical of a particular person or thing. <i>She seemed <b>uncharacteristically</b> quiet.</i>
<b>withdrawal</b>	A retraction of a previously held position. <i>The nurse was expert at the <b>withdrawal</b> of blood.</i>
<b>zero</b>	Adjust an instrument to zero. <i>He <b>zeroed</b> in his rifle at 200 yards.</i>
