- Not open or affording passage or access.
- Not open to the general public.
- Used especially of mouth or eyes.
- (set theory) of an interval that contains both its endpoints.
- Limited to certain people; not open or available to all.
- Blocked against entry.
- Not open.

- (of a business) having ceased trading, especially for a short period.




Usage Examples of "Closed" as an adjective
