- *With shutters closed.*
- *(of a set) having the property that the result of a specified operation on any element of the set is itself a member of the set.*
- *Not open or affording passage or access.*
- *Not open to the general public.*
- *Used especially of mouth or eyes.*
- *(set theory) of an interval that contains both its endpoints.*
- *Limited to certain people; not open or available to all.*
- *Blocked against entry.*
- *Not open.*

- *Not having an open mind.*
- *(of a business) having ceased trading, especially for a short period.*
- *(of a curve or figure) formed from a single unbroken line.*
- *(of a society or system) not communicating with or influenced by others.*
- *Unwilling to accept new ideas.*

Not open or affording passage or access.

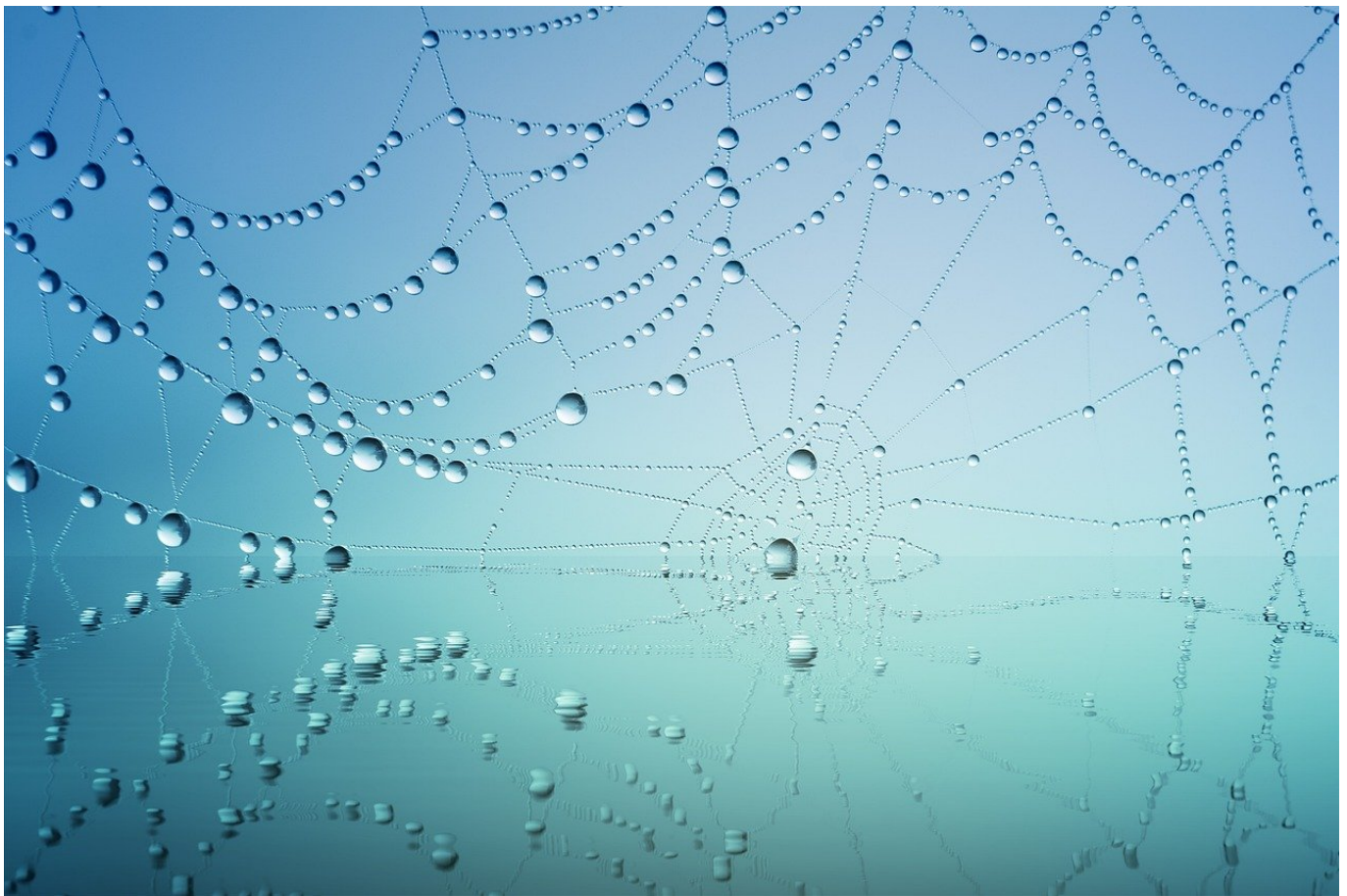
### **deaf to**

<b>elegant</b>	Suggesting taste, ease, and wealth. <i>The grand unified theory is compact and <b>elegant</b> in mathematical terms.</i>
<b>elite</b>	Selected as the best. <i><b>Elite</b> colleges.</i>
<b><u>fashionable</u></b>	Of a place frequented by fashionable people. <i><b>Fashionable</b> clothes.</i>
<b>heedless of</b>	Marked by or paying little heed or attention—Franklin D. Roosevelt.
<b>high-class</b>	Pretentiously elegant.
<b>immune to</b>	Relating to or conferring immunity (to disease or infection).
<b>indifferent to</b>	Marked by a lack of interest.
<b>invulnerable to</b>	Immune to attack; impregnable.
<b>not susceptible to</b>	Easily impressed emotionally.
<b>oblivious to</b>	Lacking conscious awareness of.
<b>premier</b>	Of earliest creation. <i>An architect of <b>premier</b> rank.</i>
<b>proof against</b>	Able to withstand.
<b>resistant to</b>	Disposed to or engaged in defiance of established authority.
<b><u>sealed</u></b>	(of walls) covered with a coat of plaster. <i><b>Sealed</b> orders.</i>
<b>select</b>	Selected or chosen for special qualifications. <i>The opera was seen by a small and highly <b>select</b> audience.</i>
<b><u>shut</u></b>	Used especially of mouth or eyes. <i>The door slammed <b>shut</b>.</i>
<b>special</b>	Used to denote education for children with particular needs especially those with learning difficulties. <i>We want to preserve our town's <b>special</b> character.</i>
<b><u>stylish</u></b>	Fashionably elegant and sophisticated. <i>You don't have to be a designer to create a <b>stylish</b> look in your own small room.</i>
<b>tight</b>	Of a community or other group of people having close relations tight knit. <i>She released her <b>tight</b> hold on the dog.</i>
<b>unaffected by</b>	Unaware of or indifferent to.
<b>unopen</b>	Not open.



<b>unsympathetic</b>	Not sympathetic or disposed toward. <i>I m not being <b>unsympathetic</b> but I can t see why you put up with him.</i>
<b>water-repellent</b>	Hindering the penetration of water.
<b>water-resistant</b>	Hindering the penetration of water.
<b>waterproof</b>	Impervious to water. <b>Waterproof</b> ink.
<b>watertight</b>	Not allowing water to pass in or out. A <b>watertight</b> compartment.



## Usage Examples of "Closed" as an adjective

- You're facing the situation with a closed mind.
- He sat quietly with closed eyes.
- The many closed streets made travel difficult.
- A closed meeting.
- Our neighbors peeped from behind closed curtains.

- *The perception of the Soviet Union as a closed society had changed.*
- *Rooms with closed doors lined the hallway.*
- *A closed porch.*
- *He put the 'Closed' sign up on the door.*
- *A closed mind unreceptive to new ideas.*
- *The UN Security Council met in closed session.*
- *He sat with his eyes closed.*



## Associations of "Closed" (30 Words)

<b><u>airtight</u></b>	Not allowing air to escape or pass through. An <b><i>airtight</i></b> box.
<b>barred</b>	Marked with stripes or bands. A <b><i>barred</i></b> gate.
<b>blocked</b>	(of email or a website) prevented from being accessed or used. The repaving results in many <b><i>blocked</i></b> streets.
<b>capsule</b>	Enclose in a capsule. A <b><i>capsule</i></b> wardrobe.
<b>compressed</b>	Reduced in volume by pressure. <b><i>Compressed</i></b> air.
<b>compressor</b>	A machine used to supply air or other gas at increased pressure, e.g. to power a gas turbine.
<b>concealed</b>	Kept secret; hidden. A <b><i>concealed</i></b> compartment in his briefcase.
<b>coronary</b>	Obstruction of blood flow in a coronary artery by a blood clot thrombus.
<b><u>door</u></b>	A doorway. His office is the third <b><i>door</i></b> down the hall on the left.
<b>envelop</b>	(of troops) surround (an enemy force). A figure <b><i>enveloped</i></b> in a black cloak.
<b><u>envelope</u></b>	The bag containing the gas in a balloon. Test pilots try to push the <b><i>envelope</i></b> .
<b>fixed</b>	Having a fixed and unchanging value. How s the club <b><i>fixed</i></b> for money now.
<b>hermetic</b>	Difficult to understand because intended for a small number of people with specialized knowledge. A <b><i>hermetic</i></b> seal that ensures perfect waterproofing.
<b>hermetically</b>	In a way that is completely airtight. A <b><i>hermetically</i></b> closed society.
<b>immobile</b>	Securely fixed in place. An <b><i>immobile</i></b> workforce.
<b>lid</b>	An eyelid. I ve got a <b><i>lid</i></b> for you to try on.
<b>obstructed</b>	Shut off to passage or view or hindered from action. Justice <b><i>obstructed</i></b> is not justice.

<b>occluded</b>	(of a substance) taken into and retained in another substance. <i>An <b>occluded</b> artery.</i>
<b>seal</b>	Close with or as if with a seal. <i>The pine boarding should be <b>sealed</b> with polyurethane.</i>
<b><u>sealed</u></b>	Undisclosed for the time being. <i>A <b>sealed</b> driveway.</i>
<b><u>shut</u></b>	Prevent from entering shut out. <i>The trees were <b>shutting</b> out all sunlight.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	A block for crushing ore in a stamp mill. <i>More men of his <b>stamp</b> are needed.</i>
<b><u>static</u></b>	Relating to statics. <i>She felt the tingle of <b>static</b> from the cat s fur.</i>
<b><u>stationary</u></b>	Not changing in quantity or condition. <i><b>Stationary</b> machinery.</i>
<b><u>stiff</u></b>	In a stiff manner. <i>I was bored <b>stiff</b> with my project.</i>
<b><u>stuck</u></b>	Baffled. <i>This problem has me completely <b>stuck</b>.</i>
<b>stuffy</b>	(of a place) lacking fresh air or ventilation. <i>Inhaling vapour from a bowl of hot water may help to clear a <b>stuffy</b> nose.</i>
<b>tight</b>	Pulled or drawn tight. <i>She released her <b>tight</b> hold on the dog.</i>
<b>unmoving</b>	Not stirring any emotion. <i>This must be the most <b>unmoving</b> performance of Verdi s opera ever recorded.</i>
<b>unopened</b>	Not yet opened or unsealed. <i><b>Unopened</b> mail.</i>
