water closet	Binary compound that occurs at room temperature as a clear colorless odorless tasteless liquid; freezes into ice below 0 degrees centigrade and boils above 100 degrees centigrade; widely used as a solvent.

- shut away** Move so that an opening or passage is obstructed; make shut.

drawer	A boxlike container in a piece of furniture; made so as to slide in and out. <i>The banker would have rights as holder to pursue the drawer.</i>
folder	A small book usually having a paper cover.
freezer	A refrigerated cabinet or room for preserving food at very low temperatures. <i>There are some steaks in the freezer.</i>
fridge	A refrigerator in which the coolant is pumped around by an electric motor. <i>She put the carton of milk back in the fridge.</i>
furnishing	The act of providing a house or room with furniture and other removable items such as shelves, carpets, appliances, etc. <i>The furnishing comprised three easy chairs and one oval table.</i>

<u>furniture</u>	The small accessories or fittings that are required for a particular task or function. <i>There was only one piece of furniture in the room.</i>
interior	Situated further in or within. <i>Interior regions of the earth.</i>
kettle	The quantity a kettle will hold. <i>A kettle pond.</i>
<u>kitchen</u>	A set of fittings and units that are sold together and fixed in place in a kitchen. <i>A fully fitted kitchen at a bargain price.</i>
larder	A small storeroom for storing foods or wines.
loft	Store in a loft. <i>Loft a ball.</i>
rack	Torture on the rack. <i>Rack one s brains.</i>
redecorate	Apply paint or wallpaper in (a room or building) again, typically differently. <i>You will have to redecorate the room afterwards.</i>
refrigerator	An appliance or compartment which is artificially kept cool and used to store food and drink Modern refrigerators generally make use of the cooling effect produced when a volatile liquid is forced to evaporate in a sealed system in which it can be condensed back to liquid outside the refrigerator.
<u>room</u>	A set of rooms typically rented in which a person couple or family live. <i>She made room for Josh on the sofa.</i>
<u>shelf</u>	A submarine bank or a part of the continental shelf.
<u>sofa</u>	A long upholstered seat with a back and arms, for two or more people. <i>Sofa cushions.</i>
