### Definitions of "Clothe" as a verb

- *Endow with a particular quality.*
- *Provide (someone) with clothes.*
- *Provide with clothes or put clothes on.*
- *Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.*
- *Put clothes on (oneself or someone); dress.*



## Synonyms of "Clothe" as a verb (35 Words)

- accoutre** Clothe or equip in something noticeable or impressive.  
*Magnificently **accoutred** he was led up to the high altar.*
- adorn** Furnish with power or authority; of kings or emperors.  
*Pictures and prints **adorned** his walls.*
- apparel** Provide with clothes or put clothes on.  
*All the vestments in which they used to **apparel** their Deities.*
- array** Dress someone in (the clothes specified).  
*The manifesto immediately divided the forces **arrayed** against him.*
- attire** Be dressed in clothes of a specified kind.  
*Lady Agatha was **attired** in an elaborate evening gown.*
- blanket** Cover as if with a blanket.  
*The double glazing **blankets** the noise a bit.*
- carpet** Form a carpet like cover over.  
***Carpet** the floors of the house.*

<b>cloak</b>	Cover with or as if with a cloak. <i>They sat <b>cloaked</b> and hooded.</i>
<b>confer</b>	Have a conference in order to talk something over. <i>The officials were <b>conferring</b> with allies.</i>
<b>costume</b>	Furnish with costumes as for a film or play. <i>The dolls are elaborately <b>costumed</b> in fancy nineteenth century dresses.</i>
<b>cover</b>	Cover as if with a shroud. <i>The grounds <b>covered</b> eight acres.</i>
<b>deck out</b>	Knock down with force.
<b>drape</b>	Cover or dress loosely with cloth. <i>He <b>draped</b> an arm around her shoulders.</i>
<b>dress</b>	Add a dressing to a salad. <i>She <b>dresses</b> in the latest Paris fashion.</i>
<b>enclothe</b>	Provide with clothes or put clothes on.
<b>endow</b>	Furnish with an endowment. <i>The old <b>endowed</b> grammar schools.</i>
<b>fit out</b>	Be the right size or shape; fit correctly or as desired.
<b>furnish</b>	Be a source of; provide. <i>The proprietor has <b>furnished</b> the bedrooms in a variety of styles.</i>
<b>garb</b>	Dress in distinctive clothes. <i>She was <b>garbed</b> in Indian shawls.</i>
<b>garment</b>	Provide with clothes or put clothes on.
<b>habilitate</b>	Qualify for teaching at a university in Europe. <i>Heisenberg had already <b>habilitated</b> at the University of G ttingen.</i>
<b>invest</b>	Make an investment. <i>He was <b>invested</b> as Head of State on 1 October 1936.</i>
<b>outfit</b>	Provide with (something) usually for a specific purpose. <i>Warders <b>outfitted</b> in special suits.</i>
<b>overlay</b>	Cover the surface of (something) with a coating. <i>The sow <b>overlay</b> her piglets.</i>
<b>overspread</b>	Cover the surface of; spread over. <i>A giant bramble had <b>overspread</b> the path.</i>
<b>provide</b>	Make a possibility or provide opportunity for permit to be attainable or cause to remain. <i>We <b>provided</b> the room with an electrical heater.</i>
<b>raiment</b>	Provide with clothes or put clothes on.

<b>rig</b>	Provide a sailing boat with sails and rigging. <i>They <b>rigged</b> the bomb to the ignition.</i>
<b>rig out</b>	Manipulate in a fraudulent manner.
<b>robe</b>	Put on robes especially for a formal or ceremonial occasion. <i>I went into the vestry and <b>robed</b> for the Mass.</i>
<b>serve</b>	Serve a purpose role or function. <i>The court then issues the summons and <b>serves</b> it on your debtor.</i>
<b>tog</b>	Be or get dressed for a particular occasion or activity. <i>We got <b>togged</b> up in our glad rags.</i>
<b>trick out</b>	Deceive somebody.
<b>trick up</b>	Deceive somebody.
<b>turn out</b>	Move around an axis or a center.



## Usage Examples of "Clothe" as a verb

- *Luxuriant tropical forests clothed the islands.*

- *It is clothed with an aura of respectability.*
- *Francesca was clothed in white.*
- *They already had eight children to feed and clothe.*
- *The mountain was clothed in tropical trees.*



## Associations of "Clothe" (30 Words)

<b>bedspread</b>	A decorative cloth used to cover a bed when it is not in use.
<b>brocade</b>	Thick heavy expensive material with a raised pattern. <i>The quilt was of white silk <b>brocade</b>.</i>
<b>carpet</b>	Cover completely as if with a carpet. <i>The house has fitted <b>carpets</b> throughout.</i>
<b>cashmere</b>	Woollen material made from or resembling cashmere. <i>A <b>cashmere</b> jumper.</i>
<b>cloak</b>	Dress in a cloak. <i>They sat <b>cloaked</b> and hooded.</i>
<b>clothes</b>	Bedclothes. <i>He stripped off his <b>clothes</b>.</i>
<b>cornice</b>	Furnish with a cornice.
<b>curtain</b>	Conceal or screen with a curtain. <i>It looked like <b>curtains</b> for me.</i>
<b>cushion</b>	A mechanical damper; absorbs energy of sudden impulses. <i>To <b>cushion</b> the blow wages and pensions were increased.</i>
<b>doff</b>	Remove (an item of clothing). <i>He <b>doffed</b> his hat.</i>
<b>drape</b>	A man's suit consisting of a long jacket and narrow trousers, as worn by a Teddy boy. <i>Velvet <b>drapes</b> beautifully.</i>
<b>drapery</b>	The depiction of folds of cloth in sculpture or painting. <i>The effigy is notable for its flowing <b>drapery</b>.</i>
<b>fabric</b>	Cloth or other material produced by weaving or knitting fibres. <i>Heavy cream <b>fabric</b>.</i>
<b>felt</b>	Mat together and make felt like. <i>A <b>felt</b> hat.</i>
<b>fez</b>	A felt cap (usually red) for a man; shaped like a flat-topped cone with a tassel that hangs from the crown.
<b>handkerchief</b>	A square of cotton or other finely woven material intended for wiping one's nose.
<b>hat</b>	Furnish with a hat. <i>Wearing her scientific <b>hat</b> she is director of a pharmacology research group.</i>

<b>headdress</b>	An ornamental covering or band for the head, especially one worn on ceremonial occasions. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl <b>headdress</b>.</i>
<b>kerchief</b>	A handkerchief.
<b>mask</b>	Cover the face with a mask. <i>They moved in under a <b>mask</b> of friendship.</i>
<b>napkin</b>	A square piece of cloth or paper used at a meal to wipe the fingers or lips and to protect garments. <i>She unfolded her <b>napkin</b> and put it on her lap.</i>
<b>nightgown</b>	Lingerie consisting of a loose dress designed to be worn in bed by women.
<b>robe</b>	Clothe in a robe or long loose outer garment. <i>A baby in christening <b>robes</b>.</i>
<b>scarf</b>	Unite by a scarf joint. <i>A silk <b>scarf</b>.</i>
<b>shutter</b>	Close the shutters of a window or building. <i>Painted wooden <b>shutters</b>.</i>
<b>towel</b>	Wipe with a towel. <i>She <b>towelled</b> her hair dry.</i>
<b>valance</b>	A protective panel screening the wheels of a vehicle.
<b>veil</b>	A membrane that is attached to the immature fruiting body of some toadstools and ruptures in the course of development either universal veil enclosing the whole fruiting body or partial veil joining the edges of the cap to the stalk. <i>She <b>veiled</b> her face.</i>
<b>wear</b>	Have in one's aspect wear an expression of one's attitude or personality. <i>The tires showed uneven <b>wear</b>.</i>
<b>yarn</b>	Tell or spin a yarn. <i>He had a bit of a <b>yarn</b> with the others.</i>
