Associations of "Clouds" (30 Words)

aerosol	A container holding an aerosol. <i>The organisms are spread in the aerosols generated by showers.</i>
atmospheric	Relating to the atmosphere of the earth. <i>Atmospheric pollution.</i>
blur	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The fog blurs my vision.</i>
blurry	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Vision may be hazy or blurry for a few days after surgery.</i>
churn	Produce butter by churning milk or cream. <i>A milk churn.</i>
cloudy	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>The pond water is slightly cloudy.</i>
droplet	A tiny drop. <i>Droplets of water.</i>
faint	Lose consciousness for a short time because of a temporarily insufficient supply of oxygen to the brain. <i>A faint hissing sound.</i>
fog	Make less visible or unclear. <i>Hot steam drifted about her fogging up the window.</i>
foggy	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>She was foggy with sleep.</i>
haze	Obscure with a haze. <i>An alcoholic haze.</i>
hazy	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely hazy.</i>
humid	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>Humid weather.</i>

indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>An indistinct memory.</i>
mist	Spray finely or cover with mist. <i>The peaks were shrouded in mist.</i>
misty	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
moisten	Moisten with fine drops. <i>The dew moistened the meadows.</i>
murky	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i>Murky waters.</i>
nebulous	Lacking definition or definite content- Jane Austen. <i>Nebulous reasons.</i>
opaque	An opaque thing. <i>Opaque windows of the jail.</i>
overcast	Sew with an overcast stitch from one section to the next. <i>Fall weather often overcasts our beaches.</i>
precipitation	The process of forming a chemical precipitate. <i>The storm brought several inches of precipitation.</i>
roil	Make turbid by stirring up the sediments of. <i>The sea roiled below her.</i>
sky	The atmosphere and outer space as viewed from the earth. <i>Dorcas had never seen so much sky.</i>
smog	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the smog.</i>
smoke	Treat fumigate or cleanse by exposure to smoke. <i>I got smoked in that fight.</i>
snow	Snow falls. <i>All that they could pick up on their screens was snow.</i>
steam	Apply steam to something fixed with adhesive so as to open or loosen it. <i>You can learn the intricacies of steaming a locomotive for the first time.</i>
turbid	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. <i>The turbid estuary.</i>
weather	Change under the action or influence of the weather. <i>This year has tested industry s ability to weather recession.</i>
