## Associations of "Clouds" (30 Words)

<b>aerosol</b>	A container holding an aerosol. <i>The organisms are spread in the <b>aerosols</b> generated by showers.</i>
<b>atmospheric</b>	Relating to the atmosphere of the earth. <i><b>Atmospheric</b> pollution.</i>
<b>blur</b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The fog <b>blurs</b> my vision.</i>
<b>blurry</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Vision may be hazy or <b>blurry</b> for a few days after surgery.</i>
<b>churn</b>	Produce butter by churning milk or cream. <i>A milk <b>churn</b>.</i>
<b>cloudy</b>	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>The pond water is slightly <b>cloudy</b>.</i>
<b>droplet</b>	A tiny drop. <i><b>Droplets</b> of water.</i>
<b>faint</b>	Lose consciousness for a short time because of a temporarily insufficient supply of oxygen to the brain. <i>A <b>faint</b> hissing sound.</i>
<b>fog</b>	Make less visible or unclear. <i>Hot steam drifted about her <b>fogging</b> up the window.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>She was <b>foggy</b> with sleep.</i>
<b>haze</b>	Obscure with a haze. <i>An alcoholic <b>haze</b>.</i>
<b>hazy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The picture we have of him is extremely <b>hazy</b>.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i><b>Humid</b> weather.</i>

<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>An <b>indistinct</b> memory.</i>
<b>mist</b>	Spray finely or cover with mist. <i>The peaks were shrouded in <b>mist</b>.</i>
<b>misty</b>	(of a person's eyes) full of tears so as to blur the vision. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>moisten</b>	Moisten with fine drops. <i>The dew <b>moistened</b> the meadows.</i>
<b>murky</b>	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i><b>Murky</b> waters.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definition or definite content- Jane Austen. <i><b>Nebulous</b> reasons.</i>
<b>opaque</b>	An opaque thing. <i><b>Opaque</b> windows of the jail.</i>
<b>overcast</b>	Sew with an overcast stitch from one section to the next. <i>Fall weather often <b>overcasts</b> our beaches.</i>
<b>precipitation</b>	The process of forming a chemical precipitate. <i>The storm brought several inches of <b>precipitation</b>.</i>
<b>roil</b>	Make turbid by stirring up the sediments of. <i>The sea <b>roiled</b> below her.</i>
<b>sky</b>	The atmosphere and outer space as viewed from the earth. <i>Dorcas had never seen so much <b>sky</b>.</i>
<b>smog</b>	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the <b>smog</b>.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Treat fumigate or cleanse by exposure to smoke. <i>I got <b>smoked</b> in that fight.</i>
<b>snow</b>	Snow falls. <i>All that they could pick up on their screens was <b>snow</b>.</i>
<b>steam</b>	Apply steam to something fixed with adhesive so as to open or loosen it. <i>You can learn the intricacies of <b>steaming</b> a locomotive for the first time.</i>
<b>turbid</b>	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. <i>The <b>turbid</b> estuary.</i>
<b>weather</b>	Change under the action or influence of the weather. <i>This year has tested industry s ability to <b>weather</b> recession.</i>
