- *Clouded as with sediment.*
- *(of a colour) having white as a constituent.*



## Synonyms of "Cloudy" as an adjective (31 Words)

<b>blurred</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The camera caught only two <b>blurred</b> images.</i>
<b>clouded</b>	Unclear in form or expression. <i>A mind <b>clouded</b> by sorrow.</i>
<b>confused</b>	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A <b>confused</b> set of instructions.</i>
<b>dull</b>	Emitting or reflecting very little light. <i><b>Dull</b> days with nothing to do.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Indistinctly expressed or remembered; obscure. <i>My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b>.</i>
<b>fuzzy</b>	Difficult to perceive; indistinct or vague. <i>Their former jolly sound has been drowned in swathes of layered <b>fuzzy</b> guitar.</i>
<b>hazy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>It was a beautiful day but quite <b>hazy</b>.</i>
<b>imprecise</b>	Not precise. <i><b>Imprecise</b> astronomical observations.</i>

<b>indefinite</b>	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>Plans are <b>indefinite</b>.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>Only <b>indistinct</b> notions of what to do.</i>
<b>lachrymose</b>	Inducing tears; sad. <i>A <b>lachrymose</b> children s classic.</i>
<b>lacking definition</b>	Inadequate in amount or degree.
<b>milky</b>	Resembling milk in colour. <i><b>Milky</b> glass.</i>
<b>mirky</b>	Clouded as with sediment.
<b>muddled</b>	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>The <b>muddled</b> display of pictures has been taken down.</i>
<b>muddy</b>	Covered in or full of mud. <i>The original colours were blurred into <b>muddy</b> pink and yellow.</i>
<a href="#"><u>murky</u></a>	Dark and gloomy, especially due to thick mist. <i><b>Murky</b> rooms lit by smoke blackened lamps.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Cloudlike, resembling a cloud or clouds.
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits. <i><b>Nebulous</b> reasons.</i>
<a href="#"><u>obscure</u></a>	Not important or well known. <i>The <b>obscure</b> light of dawn.</i>
<b>opalescent</b>	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky <b>opalescent</b> or opaline luster.</i>
<a href="#"><u>opaque</u></a>	Not clearly understood or expressed. <i>Technical jargon that was <b>opaque</b> to her.</i>
<b>overcast</b>	(of the edge of a piece of fabric) sewn with long slanting stitches to prevent fraying. <i>A chilly <b>overcast</b> day.</i>
<b>tearful</b>	Filled with or marked by tears. <i><b>Tearful</b> entreaties.</i>
<b>teary</b>	With eyes full of tears. <i>Bill said a <b>teary</b> goodbye.</i>
<b>turbid</b>	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i>The <b>turbid</b> estuary.</i>
<b>unformed</b>	Not having form or shape. <i>He had an ambitious albeit <b>unformed</b> idea for a novel.</i>



**vague**

Lacking clarity or distinctness.

*Saw a **vague** outline of a building through the fog.*

**weeping**

Used in names of tree and shrub varieties with drooping branches e.g. weeping cherry.

*The pendulous branches of a **weeping** willow.*

**weepy**

Sentimental.

*A **weepy** made for TV movie.*



## Usage Examples of "Cloudy" as an adjective

- *A very grey, cloudy day.*
- *Gropes among cloudy issues toward a feeble conclusion.*
- *Cloudy reds and blues and greens.*
- *The issue becomes more cloudy.*
- *The pond water is slightly cloudy.*
- *A cloudy liquid.*
- *She stared at him, her eyes cloudy.*

- *Cloudy skies.*



## Associations of "Cloudy" (30 Words)

<b><u>blur</u></b>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The haze <b>blurs</b> the hills.</i>
<b>blurred</b>	Unable to see or be seen clearly. <i>The <b>blurred</b> aims of the group.</i>
<b><u>blurry</u></b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>There s a very <b>blurry</b> line between art and advertising.</i>
<b><u>cloud</u></b>	Darken the sky with cloud. <i>The blue skies <b>clouded</b> over abruptly.</i>
<b><u>dim</u></b>	Made dim or less bright. <i>The <b>dim</b> drone of their voices.</i>

<b>dusky</b>	Used in names of animals with dark coloration e g dusky dolphin dusky warbler. <i><b>Dusky</b> light came from a small window.</i>
<b>faint</b>	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage. <i>A <b>faint</b> aroma.</i>
<b>fog</b>	Bewilder or puzzle. <i>A whirling <b>fog</b> of dust.</i>
<b>foggy</b>	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>She was <b>foggy</b> with sleep.</i>
<b>hazy</b>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i><b>Hazy</b> memories.</i>
<b>humid</b>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i><b>Humid</b> air.</i>
<b>inconspicuous</b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an <b>inconspicuous</b> hole.</i>
<b>indistinct</b>	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>His speech was slurred and <b>indistinct</b>.</i>
<b>lightproof</b>	Not penetrable by light. <i><b>Lightproof</b> containers.</i>
<b>lowering</b>	The act of causing to become less. <i>The <b>lowering</b> of the legal limit has exacerbated the situation.</i>
<b>mist</b>	Become covered with mist. <i>Don t <b>mist</b> furry leaved plants such as African violets.</i>
<b>misty</b>	Indistinct or dim in outline. <i>The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.</i>
<b>murkiness</b>	The quality of being cloudy.
<b>murky</b>	Dark or gloomy. <i><b>Murky</b> waters.</i>
<b>nebulous</b>	Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore. <i>A giant <b>nebulous</b> glow.</i>
<b>opaque</b>	An opaque thing. <i><b>Opaque</b> windows of the jail.</i>
<b>rain</b>	Precipitate as rain. <i>It was beginning to <b>rain</b>.</i>
<b>rainy</b>	Wet by periods of rain. <i>A <b>rainy</b> afternoon.</i>



<b>smog</b>	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the <b>smog</b>.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Inhale and exhale the smoke produced by burning a narcotic drug. <i>I m dying for a <b>smoke</b>.</i>
<b>turbid</b>	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. <i>A <b>turbid</b> piece of cin ma v rit.</i>
<b><u>unclear</u></b>	Not clear to the mind. <i>Their future remains <b>unclear</b>.</i>
<b>unintelligible</b>	Impossible to understand. <i><b>Unintelligible</b> speech.</i>
<b><u>vague</u></b>	Not precisely limited, determined, or distinguished. <i>Saw a <b>vague</b> outline of a building through the fog.</i>
<b><u>wet</u></b>	Make one s bed or clothes wet by urinating. <i>The baby was <b>wet</b> and needed changing.</i>
