Synonyms of "Cloudy" as an adjective (31 Words)

blurred	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>The camera caught only two blurred images.</i>
clouded	Unclear in form or expression. <i>A mind clouded by sorrow.</i>
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. <i>A confused set of instructions.</i>
dull	Emitting or reflecting very little light. <i>Dull days with nothing to do.</i>
<u>foggy</u>	Indistinctly expressed or remembered; obscure. <i>My memories of the event are foggy.</i>
<u>fuzzy</u>	Difficult to perceive; indistinct or vague. <i>Their former jolly sound has been drowned in swathes of layered fuzzy guitar.</i>
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>It was a beautiful day but quite hazy.</i>
imprecise	Not precise. <i>Imprecise astronomical observations.</i>

indefinite	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>Plans are indefinite.</i>
indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. <i>Only indistinct notions of what to do.</i>
lachrymose	Inducing tears; sad. <i>A lachrymose children s classic.</i>
lacking definition	Inadequate in amount or degree.
milky	Resembling milk in colour. <i>Milky glass.</i>
mirky	Clouded as with sediment.
muddled	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. <i>The muddled display of pictures has been taken down.</i>
muddy	Covered in or full of mud. <i>The original colours were blurred into muddy pink and yellow.</i>
<u>murky</u>	Dark and gloomy, especially due to thick mist. <i>Murky rooms lit by smoke blackened lamps.</i>
nebulous	Cloudlike, resembling a cloud or clouds.
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>Nebulous reasons.</i>
<u>obscure</u>	Not important or well known. <i>The obscure light of dawn.</i>
opalescent	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky opalescent or opaline luster.</i>
<u>opaque</u>	Not clearly understood or expressed. <i>Technical jargon that was opaque to her.</i>
overcast	(of the edge of a piece of fabric) sewn with long slanting stitches to prevent fraying. <i>A chilly overcast day.</i>
tearful	Filled with or marked by tears. <i>Tearful entreaties.</i>
teary	With eyes full of tears. <i>Bill said a teary goodbye.</i>
turbid	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i>The turbid estuary.</i>
unformed	Not having form or shape. <i>He had an ambitious albeit unformed idea for a novel.</i>

vague

Lacking clarity or distinctness.

Saw a **vague** outline of a building through the fog.

weeping

Used in names of tree and shrub varieties with drooping branches e.g. weeping cherry.

The pendulous branches of a **weeping** willow.

weepy

Sentimental.

A **weepy** made for TV movie.



Usage Examples of "Cloudy" as an adjective

- A very grey, cloudy day.
- Gropes among cloudy issues toward a feeble conclusion.
- Cloudy reds and blues and greens.
- The issue becomes more cloudy.
- The pond water is slightly cloudy.
- A cloudy liquid.
- She stared at him, her eyes cloudy.

- *Cloudy skies.*



Associations of "Cloudy" (30 Words)

<u>blur</u>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. <i>The haze blurs the hills.</i>
blurred	Unable to see or be seen clearly. <i>The blurred aims of the group.</i>
<u>blurry</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>There s a very blurry line between art and advertising.</i>
<u>cloud</u>	Darken the sky with cloud. <i>The blue skies clouded over abruptly.</i>
<u>dim</u>	Made dim or less bright. <i>The dim drone of their voices.</i>

dusky	Used in names of animals with dark coloration e g dusky dolphin dusky warbler. <i>Dusky light came from a small window.</i>
<u>faint</u>	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage. <i>A faint aroma.</i>
<u>fog</u>	Bewilder or puzzle. <i>A whirling fog of dust.</i>
<u>foggy</u>	Full of or characterized by fog. <i>She was foggy with sleep.</i>
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Hazy memories.</i>
<u>humid</u>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>Humid air.</i>
<u>inconspicuous</u>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an inconspicuous hole.</i>
indistinct	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>His speech was slurred and indistinct.</i>
lightproof	Not penetrable by light. <i>Lightproof containers.</i>
lowering	The act of causing to become less. <i>The lowering of the legal limit has exacerbated the situation.</i>
<u>mist</u>	Become covered with mist. <i>Don t mist furry leaved plants such as African violets.</i>
misty	Indistinct or dim in outline. <i>The misty air above the frozen river.</i>
murkiness	The quality of being cloudy.
<u>murky</u>	Dark or gloomy. <i>Murky waters.</i>
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore. <i>A giant nebulous glow.</i>
<u>opaque</u>	An opaque thing. <i>Opaque windows of the jail.</i>
rain	Precipitate as rain. <i>It was beginning to rain.</i>
rainy	Wet by periods of rain. <i>A rainy afternoon.</i>

smog	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the smog.</i>
smoke	Inhale and exhale the smoke produced by burning a narcotic drug. <i>I m dying for a smoke.</i>
turbid	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. <i>A turbid piece of cin ma v rit.</i>
<u>unclear</u>	Not clear to the mind. <i>Their future remains unclear.</i>
unintelligible	Impossible to understand. <i>Unintelligible speech.</i>
<u>vague</u>	Not precisely limited, determined, or distinguished. <i>Saw a vague outline of a building through the fog.</i>
<u>wet</u>	Make one s bed or clothes wet by urinating. <i>The baby was wet and needed changing.</i>
