Dark and gloomy, especially due to thick mist. murky

Murky rooms lit by smoke blackened lamps.

nebulose Cloudlike, resembling a cloud or clouds.

Lacking definite form or limits. nebulous

Nebulous reasons.

Not important or well known. **obscure**

The **obscure** light of dawn.

Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. opalescent

A milky **opalescent** or opaline luster.

Not clearly understood or expressed. **opaque**

Technical jargon that was **opaque** to her.

(of the edge of a piece of fabric) sewn with long slanting stitches to

prevent fraying. overcast
