- Clouded as with sediment.
- (of a colour) having white as a constituent.

blurred	Indistinct or hazy in outline. The camera caught only two <b>blurred</b> images.
clouded	Unclear in form or expression. A mind <b>clouded</b> by sorrow.
confused	Mentally confused unable to think with clarity or act intelligently. A <b>confused</b> set of instructions.
dull	Emitting or reflecting very little light. <b>Dull</b> days with nothing to do.
foggy	Indistinctly expressed or remembered; obscure. My memories of the event are <b>foggy</b> .
<u>fuzzy</u>	Difficult to perceive; indistinct or vague. Their former jolly sound has been drowned in swathes of layered <b>fuzzy</b> guitar.
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. It was a beautiful day but quite <b>hazy</b> .
imprecise	Not precise. <i>Imprecise</i> astronomical observations.



indefinite	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>Plans are <b>indefinite</b></i> .
indistinct	Not clearly defined or easy to perceive or understand. Only <b>indistinct</b> notions of what to do.
lachrymose	Inducing tears; sad. A <b>lachrymose</b> children s classic.
lacking definition	Inadequate in amount or degree.
milky	Resembling milk in colour. <i>Milky glass.</i>
mirky	Clouded as with sediment.
muddled	Confused and vague; used especially of thinking. The <b>muddled</b> display of pictures has been taken down.
muddy	Covered in or full of mud. <i>The original colours were blurred into</i> <b>muddy</b> pink and yellow.
<u>murky</u>	Dark and gloomy, especially due to thick mist. <i>Murky</i> rooms lit by smoke blackened lamps.
nebulose	Cloudlike, resembling a cloud or clouds.
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits. <i>Nebulous reasons</i> .
<u>obscure</u>	Not important or well known. The <b>obscure</b> light of dawn.
opalescent	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. A milky <b>opalescent</b> or opaline luster.
<u>opaque</u>	Not clearly understood or expressed. Technical jargon that was <b>opaque</b> to her.
overcast	(of the edge of a piece of fabric) sewn with long slanting stitches to prevent fraying. A chilly <b>overcast</b> day.
tearful	Filled with or marked by tears. <i>Tearful entreaties.</i>
teary	With eyes full of tears. Bill said a <b>teary</b> goodbye.
turbid	(of liquids) clouded as with sediment. <i>The <b>turbid</b> estuary.</i>
unformed	Not having form or shape. <i>He had an ambitious albeit</i> <b>unformed</b> <i>idea for a novel.</i>



<u>vague</u>	Lacking clarity or distinctness. Saw a <b>vague</b> outline of a building through the fog.
weeping	Used in names of tree and shrub varieties with drooping branches e g weeping cherry. <i>The pendulous branches of a <b>weeping</b> willow.</i>
weepy	Sentimental. A <b>weepy</b> made for TV movie.



#### Usage Examples of "Cloudy" as an adjective

- A very grey, cloudy day.
- Gropes among cloudy issues toward a feeble conclusion.
- Cloudy reds and blues and greens.
- The issue becomes more cloudy.
- The pond water is slightly cloudy.
- A cloudy liquid.

# Associations of "Cloudy" (30 Words)

<u>blur</u>	Make unclear indistinct or blurred. The haze <b>blur</b> s the hills.
blurred	Unable to see or be seen clearly. The <b>blurred</b> aims of the group.
<u>blurry</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. There s a very <b>blurry</b> line between art and advertising.
<u>cloud</u>	Darken the sky with cloud. The blue skies <b>cloud</b> ed over abruptly.
<u>dim</u>	Made dim or less bright. The <b>dim</b> drone of their voices.



dusky	Used in names of animals with dark coloration e g dusky dolphin dusky warbler. <b>Dusky</b> light came from a small window.
<u>faint</u>	Lacking conviction or boldness or courage. A <b>faint</b> aroma.
<u>fog</u>	Bewilder or puzzle. A whirling <b>fog</b> of dust.
<u>foggy</u>	Full of or characterized by fog. She was <b>foggy</b> with sleep.
<u>hazy</u>	Indistinct or hazy in outline. <i>Hazy memories.</i>
<u>humid</u>	Marked by a relatively high level of water vapour in the atmosphere. <i>Humid</i> air.
inconspicuous	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>He pushed the string through an</i> <b>inconspicuous</b> <i>hole.</i>
indistinct	Not clear or sharply defined. <i>His speech was slurred and indistinct</i> .
lightproof	Not penetrable by light. <i>Lightproof</i> containers.
lowering	The act of causing to become less. The <b>lowering</b> of the legal limit has exacerbated the situation.
<u>mist</u>	Become covered with mist. Don t <b>mist</b> furry leaved plants such as African violets.
misty	Indistinct or dim in outline. The <b>misty</b> air above the frozen river.
murkiness	The quality of being cloudy.
<u>murky</u>	Dark or gloomy. <b>Murky</b> waters.
nebulous	Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore. A giant <b>nebulous</b> glow.
<u>opaque</u>	An opaque thing. <i>Opaque</i> windows of the jail.
rain	Precipitate as rain. It was beginning to <b>rain</b> .
rainy	Wet by periods of rain. A <b>rainy</b> afternoon.



smog	Fog or haze intensified by smoke or other atmospheric pollutants. <i>Exhaust emissions are mainly responsible for the</i> <b>smog</b> .
smoke	Inhale and exhale the smoke produced by burning a narcotic drug. I m dying for a <b>smoke</b> .
turbid	Confused or obscure in meaning or effect. A <b>turbid</b> piece of cin ma v rit.
<u>unclear</u>	Not clear to the mind. Their future remains <b>unclear</b> .
unintelligible	Impossible to understand. <b>Unintelligible</b> speech.
<u>vague</u>	Not precisely limited, determined, or distinguished. Saw a <b>vague</b> outline of a building through the fog.
wet	Make one s bed or clothes wet by urinating. The baby was <b>wet</b> and needed changing.
