- *Totally uninformed about what is going on; not having even a clue from which to infer what is occurring.*
- *Having no knowledge, understanding, or ability.*



## Synonyms of "Clueless" as an adjective (24 Words)

- astonished** Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed.  
*I stood enthralled **astonished** by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.*
- astounded** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*
- baffled** Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment.
- befuddled** Stupefied by alcoholic drink.  
*He has an air of **befuddled** unworldliness.*
- bemused** Deeply absorbed in thought.  
*Her **bemused** expression.*
- bewildered** Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment.  
***Bewildered** and confused.*

<b>dazed</b>	Unable to think or react properly; bewildered. <i>A <b>dazed</b> expression.</i>
<b>discomfited</b>	Disappointingly unsuccessful.
<b>discomposed</b>	Disturbed or agitated. <i>Looked about with a wandering and <b>discomposed</b> air.</i>
<b>disconcerted</b>	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion. <i>Keith looked momentarily <b>disconcerted</b>.</i>
<b><u>disoriented</u></b>	Socially disoriented. <i>She was so <b>disoriented</b> that Joe had to walk her to her room.</i>
<b><u>dumbfounded</u></b>	Greatly astonished or amazed. <i>Jay explained to a <b>dumbfounded</b> Nick.</i>
<b>fuddled</b>	Confused or stupefied, especially as a result of drinking alcohol. <i><b>Fuddled</b> drinkers spilt their brandy and slid beneath the table.</i>
<b>muddled</b>	Not arranged in order; untidy. <i>Such a view reflects <b>muddled</b> thinking.</i>
<b>mystified</b>	Totally perplexed and mixed up.
<b>nonplussed</b>	Not disconcerted; unperturbed. <i>Henry looked completely <b>nonplussed</b>.</i>
<b><u>perplexed</u></b>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i><b>Perplexed</b> state of the world.</i>
<b><u>puzzled</u></b>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>The questioners were met with <b>puzzled</b> looks.</i>
<b>shaken</b>	Disturbed psychologically as if by a physical jolt or shock. <i>The accident left her badly <b>shaken</b>.</i>
<b><u>stunned</u></b>	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow. <i>Lay semiconscious <b>stunned</b> or stupefied by the blow.</i>
<b>stupefied</b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>Lay semiconscious stunned or <b>stupefied</b> by the blow.</i>
<b><u>thrown</u></b>	Twisted together; as of filaments spun into a thread. <i>The <b>thrown</b> rider got back on his horse.</i>
<b><u>troubled</u></b>	Beset by problems or difficulties. <i><b>Troubled</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>unnerved</b>	Deprived of courage and strength. <i>The steeplejack exhausted and <b>unnerved</b> couldn't hold on to his dangerous perch much longer.</i>
