Synonyms of "Clueless" as an adjective (24 Words)

<u>astonished</u>	Greatly surprised or impressed; amazed. <i>I stood enthralled astonished by the vastness and majesty of the cathedral.</i>
astounded	Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock. <i>Astounded viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.</i>
baffled	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment.
befuddled	Stupefied by alcoholic drink. <i>He has an air of befuddled unworldliness.</i>
<u>bemused</u>	Deeply absorbed in thought. <i>Her bemused expression.</i>
bewildered	Perplexed by many conflicting situations or statements; filled with bewilderment. <i>Bewildered and confused.</i>

dazed	Unable to think or react properly; bewildered. <i>A dazed expression.</i>
discomfited	Disappointingly unsuccessful.
discomposed	Disturbed or agitated. <i>Looked about with a wandering and discomposed air.</i>
disconcerted	Having self-possession upset; thrown into confusion. <i>Keith looked momentarily disconcerted.</i>
<u>disoriented</u>	Socially disoriented. <i>She was so disoriented that Joe had to walk her to her room.</i>
<u>dumbfounded</u>	Greatly astonished or amazed. <i>Jay explained to a dumbfounded Nick.</i>
fuddled	Confused or stupefied, especially as a result of drinking alcohol. <i>Fuddled drinkers spilt their brandy and slid beneath the table.</i>
muddled	Not arranged in order; untidy. <i>Such a view reflects muddled thinking.</i>
mystified	Totally perplexed and mixed up.
nonplussed	Not disconcerted; unperturbed. <i>Henry looked completely nonplussed.</i>
<u>perplexed</u>	Completely baffled; very puzzled. <i>Perplexed state of the world.</i>
<u>puzzled</u>	Filled with bewilderment. <i>The questioners were met with puzzled looks.</i>
shaken	Disturbed psychologically as if by a physical jolt or shock. <i>The accident left her badly shaken.</i>
<u>stunned</u>	Knocked unconscious by a heavy blow. <i>Lay semiconscious stunned or stupefied by the blow.</i>
stupefied	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>Lay semiconscious stunned or stupefied by the blow.</i>
<u>thrown</u>	Twisted together; as of filaments spun into a thread. <i>The thrown rider got back on his horse.</i>
<u>troubled</u>	Beset by problems or difficulties. <i>Troubled teenagers.</i>
unnerved	Deprived of courage and strength. <i>The steeplejack exhausted and unnerved couldn't hold on to his dangerous perch much longer.</i>
