<b>amateurish</b>	Done in an unskilful or inept way. <i>A very <b>amateurish</b> job.</i>
<b>awkward</b>	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i><b>Awkward</b> and reserved at parties.</i>
<b>boor</b>	A crude uncouth ill-bred person lacking culture or refinement. <i>At last the big obnoxious <b>boor</b> had been dealt a stunning blow for his uncouth and belligerent manner.</i>
<b>boorish</b>	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Was <b>boorish</b> and insensitive.</i>
<b>bungling</b>	Showing lack of skill or aptitude. <i>He was heavily criticized for his <b>bungling</b> of the case.</i>
<a href="#">crude</a>	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>A <b>crude</b> estimate of the number of people available for work.</i>
<b>forgetful</b>	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. <i>She was soon <b>forgetful</b> of the time.</i>
<b>gauche</b>	Lacking social polish. <i>Their excellent manners always made me feel <b>gauche</b>.</i>
<b>gawky</b>	Nervously awkward and ungainly. <i>A <b>gawky</b> lad with long ungainly legs.</i>
<b>graceless</b>	Lacking grace; clumsy- Sir Walter Scott. <i>A totally <b>graceless</b> hostess.</i>
<b>incompetent</b>	An incompetent person. <i><b>Incompetent</b> witnesses.</i>
<a href="#">inconsiderate</a>	Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others. <i>It s <b>inconsiderate</b> of her to go away without telling us.</i>

<b>inelegant</b>	Having or showing a lack of physical grace, elegance, or refinement. <i>He came skidding to an <b>inelegant</b> halt.</i>
<b>inept</b>	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more <b>inept</b> than to repeat it now.</i>
<b>loutish</b>	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>The <b>loutish</b> manners of a bully.</i>
<b>maladroit</b>	Inefficient or inept; clumsy. <i><b>Maladroit</b> propaganda.</i>
<b>oafish</b>	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i><b>Oafish</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>poor</b>	Of a low or inferior standard or quality. <i>His <b>poor</b> distorted limbs.</i>
<b>rough</b>	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>She had to <b>rough</b> it alone in digs.</i>
<b>solecism</b>	A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
<b>tactless</b>	Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse. <i>In the circumstances it was <b>tactless</b> to ask her age.</i>
<b>ungainly</b>	(of a person or movement) awkward; clumsy. <i>A gawky lad with long <b>ungainly</b> legs.</i>
<b>unmindful</b>	Not conscious or aware. <i>Danielle seemed <b>unmindful</b> of her parents plight.</i>
<b>unprofessional</b>	Below or contrary to the standards expected in a particular profession. <i><b>Unprofessional</b> repairs.</i>
<b>unrefined</b>	Not refined or processed. <i><b>Unrefined</b> ore.</i>
<b>unskilled</b>	Not having or showing or requiring special skill or proficiency. <i>An <b>unskilled</b> painting.</i>
<b>unskillful</b>	Poorly done. <i>It was an <b>unskillful</b> attempt.</i>
<b>unsophisticated</b>	Not complicated or highly developed; basic. <i>An <b>unsophisticated</b> young man.</i>
<b>unwieldy</b>	Difficult to use or handle or manage because of size or weight or shape. <i>We set about towing the <b>unwieldy</b> structure into the shelter.</i>
<b>weird</b>	Strikingly odd or unusual. <i>All sorts of <b>weird</b> and wonderful characters.</i>
