amateurish	Done in an unskilful or inept way. <i>A very amateurish job.</i>
awkward	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i>Awkward and reserved at parties.</i>
boor	A crude uncouth ill-bred person lacking culture or refinement. <i>At last the big obnoxious boor had been dealt a stunning blow for his uncouth and belligerent manner.</i>
boorish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Was boorish and insensitive.</i>
bungling	Showing lack of skill or aptitude. <i>He was heavily criticized for his bungling of the case.</i>
crude	Belonging to an early stage of technical development characterized by simplicity and often crudeness. <i>A crude estimate of the number of people available for work.</i>
forgetful	Not mindful or attentive- G.B.Shaw. <i>She was soon forgetful of the time.</i>
gauche	Lacking social polish. <i>Their excellent manners always made me feel gauche.</i>
gawky	Nervously awkward and ungainly. <i>A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.</i>
graceless	Lacking grace; clumsy- Sir Walter Scott. <i>A totally graceless hostess.</i>
incompetent	An incompetent person. <i>Incompetent witnesses.</i>
inconsiderate	Lacking regard for the rights or feelings of others. <i>It s inconsiderate of her to go away without telling us.</i>

inelegant	Having or showing a lack of physical grace, elegance, or refinement. <i>He came skidding to an inelegant halt.</i>
inept	Not elegant or graceful in expression. <i>If the rumor is true can anything be more inept than to repeat it now.</i>
loutish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>The loutish manners of a bully.</i>
maladroit	Inefficient or inept; clumsy. <i>Maladroit propaganda.</i>
oafish	Ill-mannered and coarse and contemptible in behavior or appearance. <i>Oafish behaviour.</i>
poor	Of a low or inferior standard or quality. <i>His poor distorted limbs.</i>
rough	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>She had to rough it alone in digs.</i>
solecism	A breach of good manners; an instance of incorrect behaviour.
tactless	Revealing lack of perceptiveness or judgment or finesse. <i>In the circumstances it was tactless to ask her age.</i>
ungainly	(of a person or movement) awkward; clumsy. <i>A gawky lad with long ungainly legs.</i>
unmindful	Not conscious or aware. <i>Danielle seemed unmindful of her parents plight.</i>
unprofessional	Below or contrary to the standards expected in a particular profession. <i>Unprofessional repairs.</i>
unrefined	Not refined or processed. <i>Unrefined ore.</i>
unskilled	Not having or showing or requiring special skill or proficiency. <i>An unskilled painting.</i>
unskillful	Poorly done. <i>It was an unskillful attempt.</i>
unsophisticated	Not complicated or highly developed; basic. <i>An unsophisticated young man.</i>
unwieldy	Difficult to use or handle or manage because of size or weight or shape. <i>We set about towing the unwieldy structure into the shelter.</i>
weird	Strikingly odd or unusual. <i>All sorts of weird and wonderful characters.</i>
