sea-coast	The shore of a sea or ocean.



seaboard	The shore of a sea or ocean regarded as a resort. The eastern seaboard of the United States.

seashore	An area of sandy, stony, or rocky land bordering and level with the sea.
seaside	A place by the sea, especially a beach area or holiday resort. A day at the seaside .
<u>shore</u>	The land along the edge of a body of water. I made for the shore .
shoreline	The line along which a large body of water meets the land. <i>He walked along the shoreline</i> .
<u>slide</u>	Slide guitar. Use an ice axe to halt a slide on ice and snow.
water's edge	A slight competitive advantage.
waterfront	The area of a city (such as a harbor or dockyard) alongside a body of water. <i>A hotel on the waterfront</i> .
waterside	The edge of or area adjoining a sea, lake, or river. <i>Waterside</i> vegetation.

isthmus	A relatively narrow strip of land (with water on both sides) connecting two larger land areas.

lagoon	A small freshwater lake near a larger lake or river.
north	The compass point corresponding to north. They were sheltering from the north winds.

offshore	(of a wind) blowing towards the sea from the land. <i>He predicts that 750 000 UK jobs will be offshored in the next 10 years.</i>
peninsula	A piece of land almost surrounded by water or projecting out into a body of water.
peninsular	Of or forming or resembling a peninsula. The counties of peninsular Florida.
reef	Reduce a sail by taking in a reef. Reef the sailboat s mast.
seabed	The ground under the sea; the ocean floor.
seashore	The land between high- and low-water marks.
seaweed	Plant growing in the sea, especially marine algae. <i>Seaweeds abound on most shores.</i>



<u>shore</u>	Serve as a shore to. <i>Record companies have been anxious to import the music to American</i> <i>shore</i> s.
southeast	The southeastern region of the United States. <i>Southeast</i> erly breezes.
strait	Narrow. The economy is in dire strait s.
tidal	Relating to or affected by tides. <i>The river here is not tidal.</i>
