<b>finish</b>	The act of finishing. <i>Lightweight nylon with a shiny <b>finish</b>.</i>
<b>fleece</b>	A jacket or other garment made from a fleece fabric. <i>A reversible <b>fleece</b> jacket.</i>
<b>fur</b>	Animal skin with fur on it or fabric resembling this used in making or trimming garments. <i>A <b>fur</b> coat.</i>
<b>glaze</b>	A thin topcoat of transparent paint used to modify the tone of an underlying colour. <i>The <b>glaze</b> of the white cups.</i>
<b>hair</b>	Hairs collectively especially those growing on a person s head. <i>Her shoulder length fair <b>hair</b>.</i>
<b>lamination</b>	Bonding thin sheets together.
<b>layer</b>	Single thickness of usually some homogeneous substance. <i>They can be increased from cuttings and <b>layers</b>.</i>
<b>lustre</b>	Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware. <i>She couldn t eat and her hair lost its <b>lustre</b>.</i>
<b>mantle</b>	The part of another planetary body corresponding to the earth s mantle. <i>Magmas erupted at mid ocean ridges are derived from the upper <b>mantle</b>.</i>
<b>overcoat</b>	A long warm coat.
<b>overlay</b>	A block of code or other data transferred during the overlay process. <i>A durable cost effective floor <b>overlay</b>.</i>

<b>paint</b>	An act of painting something. <i>A <b>paint</b> program.</i>
<b>patina</b>	A fine coating of oxide on the surface of a metal. <i>Many bronzes have been overcleaned their original <b>patina</b> removed and artificially replaced.</i>
<b>pelage</b>	The fur, hair, or wool of a mammal.
<b>plating</b>	The process of applying plating. <i>The tractors carried steel <b>plating</b> for protection.</i>
<b>scale</b>	(music) a series of notes differing in pitch according to a specific scheme (usually within an octave). <i>The <b>scale</b> of the map.</i>
<b>sheet</b>	A quantity of text or other information contained on a sheet of paper. <i><b>Sheet</b> ice.</i>
<b>skim</b>	An act of reading something quickly or superficially. <i>A quick <b>skim</b> through the pamphlet.</i>
<b>skin</b>	The skin of a dead animal with or without the fur used as material for clothing or other items. <i>A flap of <b>skin</b>.</i>
<b>smear</b>	A thin tissue or blood sample spread on a glass slide and stained for cytologic examination and diagnosis under a microscope. <i>There was an oil <b>smear</b> on his jacket.</i>
<b>stain</b>	A thing that damages or brings disgrace to someone or something's reputation. <i>There were mud <b>stains</b> on my shoes.</i>
<b>topping</b>	A layer of food poured or spread over a base of a different type of food to add flavour. <i>A cake with a marzipan <b>topping</b>.</i>
<b>tunic</b>	A loose garment, typically sleeveless and reaching to the knees, as worn in ancient Greece and Rome. <i>A line <b>tunic</b> tops.</i>
<b>varnish</b>	An external or superficially attractive appearance of a specific quality. <i>The wood was stained with a dark <b>varnish</b>.</i>
<b>veneer</b>	A thin decorative covering of fine wood applied to a coarser wood or other material. <i>A fine grained <b>veneer</b>.</i>
<b>wash</b>	An act of washing something or an instance of being washed. <i>Her hair needs a <b>wash</b>.</i>

<b>inlay</b>	Embed (material or a design) flush with the surface of an object. <i>Mahogany panelling <b>inlaid</b> with rosewood.</i>
<b>laminate</b>	Create laminate by bonding sheets of material with a bonding material. <i><b>Laminate</b> the table.</i>
<b>line</b>	Mark or cover with lines. <i>Sorrow had <b>lined</b> his face.</i>
<b>mantle</b>	Cover like a mantle. <i>The ivy <b>mantles</b> the building.</i>
<b>overlay</b>	(of a quality or feeling) become more prominent than (a previous quality or feeling). <i>The sow <b>overlay</b> her piglets.</i>
<b>overspread</b>	Spread across or over. <i>A giant bramble had <b>overspread</b> the path.</i>
<b><u>paint</u></b>	Create a graphic or screen display using a paint program. <i>Flying behind hills lessens the enemy's ability to <b>paint</b> you with radar.</i>



<b>pave</b>	Cover (a piece of ground) with flat stones or bricks; lay paving over. <i><b>Pave</b> the roads in the village.</i>
<b>plaster</b>	Coat with plaster. <i>The demonstrators <b>plastered</b> the hallways with posters.</i>
<b>plate</b>	Cover an object with plates of metal for decoration protection or strength. <i>Overcooked vegetables won't look appetizing no matter how they are <b>plated</b>.</i>
<b>put a facing on</b>	Cause (someone) to undergo something.
<b>skin</b>	Cover with skin. <i>She <b>skinned</b> the pig and salted the carcass.</i>
<b>smear</b>	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>Her lipstick was <b>smear</b>ed.</i>
<b>surface</b>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>I hope the lost key is going to <b>surface</b> again.</i>
<b>varnish</b>	Apply varnish to. <i>We stripped the floor and <b>varnished</b> it.</i>
<b>veneer</b>	Cover with veneer. <i>Factories employed cabinetmakers to <b>veneer</b> looking glasses.</i>
<b>wash</b>	Wash or flow against. <i>A linen mix yarn which <b>washes</b> well.</i>

<b>garment</b>	An item of clothing. <i>Garments of the finest silk.</i>
<b>glove</b>	Of a wicketkeeper baseball catcher etc catch deflect or touch the ball with a gloved hand. <i>Rubber <b>gloves</b>.</i>
<b>hat</b>	Furnish with a hat. <i>A black straw <b>hat</b>.</i>
<b>headdress</b>	An ornamental covering or band for the head, especially one worn on ceremonial occasions. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl <b>headdress</b>.</i>
<b>jacket</b>	Cover with a jacket. <i>Potatoes cooked in their <b>jackets</b>.</i>
<b>mitten</b>	Glove that encases the thumb separately and the other four fingers together.
<b>mohair</b>	A yarn or fabric made from mohair typically mixed with wool. <i>A <b>mohair</b> sweater.</i>
<b>mottled</b>	Having spots or patches of color. <i>A bird with <b>mottled</b> brown plumage.</i>
<b>patterned</b>	Decorated with a repeated design; having a pattern or patterns. <i>She wore leather trousers and a <b>patterned</b> shirt.</i>
<b>robe</b>	Clothe formally especially in ecclesiastical robes. <i>A baby in christening <b>robes</b>.</i>
<b>scarf</b>	Wrap in or adorn with a scarf. <i>A silk <b>scarf</b>.</i>
<b>shirt</b>	Put a shirt on. <i>Smith increased his chances of a Great Britain <b>shirt</b> with a penalty shot save.</i>
<b>skirt</b>	Extend on all sides of simultaneously; encircle. <i>The boat <b>skirted</b> the coast.</i>
<b>smear</b>	Cover a surface by smearing a substance over it. <i><b>Smear</b> the wall with paint.</i>
<b>speckle</b>	A small contrasting part of something. <i><b>Speckle</b> the wall with tiny yellow spots.</i>
<b>spotted</b>	Marked or decorated with spots. <i>A red <b>spotted</b> handkerchief.</i>
<b>striped</b>	Marked with or having stripes. <i>A green <b>striped</b> coat.</i>

- sweater** A knitted garment worn on the upper body, typically with long sleeves, put on over the head.  
*A close knit wool **sweater** for icy weather.*
- sweatshirt** A loose, warm sweater, typically made of cotton, worn when exercising or as leisurewear.
- undershirt** A collarless men's undergarment for the upper part of the body.
- variegate** Make more diverse or varied.  
*The musicians **variegate** the pitch.*
- variegated** Exhibiting different colours, especially as irregular patches or streaks.

- vest** Become legally vested.  
*The local planning authorities are **vested** with powers to regulate land use and development.*
- waistcoat** A close-fitting waist-length garment, typically having no sleeves or collar and buttoning down the front, worn especially by men over a shirt and under a jacket.
