crust	A hardened layer, coating, or deposit on the surface of something soft. <i>A sandwich with the crusts cut off.</i>
daub	Material used to daub walls. <i>A daub of paint.</i>
deposit	Money deposited in a bank or some similar institution. <i>I d like to make a deposit.</i>
dusting	Fine powdery material such as dry earth or pollen that can be blown about in the air.
facing	An ornamental coating to a building. <i>The bricks were used as a facing on a concrete core.</i>
film	Material in the form of a very thin flexible sheet. <i>A horror film.</i>
finish	The act of finishing. <i>Lightweight nylon with a shiny finish.</i>
fleece	A jacket or other garment made from a fleece fabric. <i>A reversible fleece jacket.</i>
fur	Animal skin with fur on it or fabric resembling this used in making or trimming garments. <i>A fur coat.</i>
glaze	A thin topcoat of transparent paint used to modify the tone of an underlying colour. <i>The glaze of the white cups.</i>
hair	Hairs collectively especially those growing on a person s head. <i>Her shoulder length fair hair.</i>
lamination	Bonding thin sheets together.
layer	Single thickness of usually some homogeneous substance. <i>They can be increased from cuttings and layers.</i>
lustre	Ceramics with an iridescent metallic glaze lustreware. <i>She couldn t eat and her hair lost its lustre.</i>
mantle	The part of another planetary body corresponding to the earth s mantle. <i>Magmas erupted at mid ocean ridges are derived from the upper mantle.</i>
overcoat	A long warm coat.
overlay	A block of code or other data transferred during the overlay process. <i>A durable cost effective floor overlay.</i>

<u>paint</u>	An act of painting something. A paint program.
patina	A fine coating of oxide on the surface of a metal. <i>Many bronzes have been overcleaned their original patina removed and artificially replaced.</i>
pelage	The fur, hair, or wool of a mammal.
plating	The process of applying plating. <i>The tractors carried steel plating for protection.</i>
scale	(music) a series of notes differing in pitch according to a specific scheme (usually within an octave). <i>The scale of the map.</i>
sheet	A quantity of text or other information contained on a sheet of paper. Sheet ice.
<u>skim</u>	An act of reading something quickly or superficially. <i>A quick skim through the pamphlet.</i>
<u>skin</u>	The skin of a dead animal with or without the fur used as material for clothing or other items. <i>A flap of skin.</i>
smear	A thin tissue or blood sample spread on a glass slide and stained for cytologic examination and diagnosis under a microscope. <i>There was an oil smear on his jacket.</i>
stain	A thing that damages or brings disgrace to someone or something's reputation. <i>There were mud stains on my shoes.</i>
topping	A layer of food poured or spread over a base of a different type of food to add flavour. <i>A cake with a marzipan topping.</i>
<u>tunic</u>	A loose garment, typically sleeveless and reaching to the knees, as worn in ancient Greece and Rome. <i>A line tunic tops.</i>
varnish	An external or superficially attractive appearance of a specific quality. <i>The wood was stained with a dark varnish.</i>
<u>veneer</u>	A thin decorative covering of fine wood applied to a coarser wood or other material. <i>A fine grained veneer.</i>
<u>wash</u>	An act of washing something or an instance of being washed. <i>Her hair needs a wash.</i>

Yarn or textile fibre made from wool.

*Her blue **wool** suit.*

bedaub	Spread or daub (a surface). <i>A dozen maidens all bedaubed with paint.</i>
<u>blanket</u>	Form a blanket like cover over. <i>The double glazing blankets the noise a bit.</i>
cake	Form a coat over. <i>The blood under his nose was beginning to cake.</i>
cover	Provide with a covering or cause to be covered. <i>She raised her gun to cover Klift.</i>
daub	Spread (a thick or sticky substance) on a surface in a careless or clumsy way. <i>They daubed graffiti on the walls.</i>
<u>dress</u>	Dress in a certain manner. <i>Dress the windows.</i>

laminate	Create laminate by bonding sheets of material with a bonding material. <i>Laminate the table.</i>
line	Mark or cover with lines. <i>Sorrow had lined his face.</i>
mantle	Cover like a mantle. <i>The ivy mantles the building.</i>
overlay	(of a quality or feeling) become more prominent than (a previous quality or feeling). <i>The sow overlay her piglets.</i>
overspread	Spread across or over. <i>A giant bramble had overspread the path.</i>
<u>paint</u>	Create a graphic or screen display using a paint program. <i>Flying behind hills lessens the enemy's ability to paint you with radar.</i>

pave	Cover (a piece of ground) with flat stones or bricks; lay paving over. <i>Pave the roads in the village.</i>
plaster	Coat with plaster. <i>The demonstrators plastered the hallways with posters.</i>
<u>plate</u>	Cover an object with plates of metal for decoration protection or strength. <i>Overcooked vegetables won't look appetizing no matter how they are plated.</i>
put a facing on	Cause (someone) to undergo something.
<u>skin</u>	Cover with skin. <i>She skinned the pig and salted the carcass.</i>
smear	Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>Her lipstick was smeared.</i>
<u>surface</u>	Rise or come up to the surface of the water or the ground. <i>I hope the lost key is going to surface again.</i>
varnish	Apply varnish to. <i>We stripped the floor and varnished it.</i>
<u>veneer</u>	Cover with veneer. <i>Factories employed cabinetmakers to veneer looking glasses.</i>
<u>wash</u>	Wash or flow against. <i>A linen mix yarn which washes well.</i>

blouse	A loose linen or cotton garment formerly worn by peasants and manual workers, typically belted at the waist. <i>I bloused my trousers over my boots.</i>
<u>cape</u>	In bullfighting taunt the bull by flourishing a cape. <i>The hair on a cape for the taxidermist can spoil in warm weather.</i>
cashmere	Woollen material made from or resembling cashmere. <i>A cashmere jumper.</i>
clothes	Bedclothes. <i>He stripped off his clothes.</i>
dappled	Marked with spots or rounded patches. <i>The horse s dappled flank.</i>
fleck	A small contrasting part of something. <i>A fleck of red.</i>

garment	An item of clothing. <i>Garments of the finest silk.</i>
glove	Of a wicketkeeper baseball catcher etc catch deflect or touch the ball with a gloved hand. <i>Rubber gloves.</i>
hat	Furnish with a hat. <i>A black straw hat.</i>
headdress	An ornamental covering or band for the head, especially one worn on ceremonial occasions. <i>A veil held in place with a pearl headdress.</i>
jacket	Cover with a jacket. <i>Potatoes cooked in their jackets.</i>
mitten	Glove that encases the thumb separately and the other four fingers together.
mohair	A yarn or fabric made from mohair typically mixed with wool. <i>A mohair sweater.</i>
mottled	Having spots or patches of color. <i>A bird with mottled brown plumage.</i>
patterned	Decorated with a repeated design; having a pattern or patterns. <i>She wore leather trousers and a patterned shirt.</i>
robe	Clothe formally especially in ecclesiastical robes. <i>A baby in christening robes.</i>
scarf	Wrap in or adorn with a scarf. <i>A silk scarf.</i>
shirt	Put a shirt on. <i>Smith increased his chances of a Great Britain shirt with a penalty shot save.</i>
skirt	Extend on all sides of simultaneously; encircle. <i>The boat skirted the coast.</i>
smear	Cover a surface by smearing a substance over it. <i>Smear the wall with paint.</i>
speckle	A small contrasting part of something. <i>Speckle the wall with tiny yellow spots.</i>
spotted	Marked or decorated with spots. <i>A red spotted handkerchief.</i>
striped	Marked with or having stripes. <i>A green striped coat.</i>

- sweater** A knitted garment worn on the upper body, typically with long sleeves, put on over the head.
*A close knit wool **sweater** for icy weather.*
- sweatshirt** A loose, warm sweater, typically made of cotton, worn when exercising or as leisurewear.
- undershirt** A collarless men's undergarment for the upper part of the body.
- variegate** Make more diverse or varied.
*The musicians **variegate** the pitch.*
- variegated** Exhibiting different colours, especially as irregular patches or streaks.
*His **variegated** and amusing observations.*
- vest** Become legally vested.
*The local planning authorities are **vested** with powers to regulate land use and development.*
- waistcoat** A close-fitting waist-length garment, typically having no sleeves or collar and buttoning down the front, worn especially by men over a shirt and under a jacket.
