grade	Arrange in or allocate to grades classify or sort. <i>Grade tests.</i>
group	Form a group or group together. <i>Growers began to group together to form cooperatives.</i>
index	List in an index. <i>The pins are retracted and indexed to occupy an adjacent slotted position.</i>
list	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>Local offices are listed in the phone book.</i>
log	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. <i>Control room staff resorted to using pen and paper to log calls.</i>
marshal	Make ready for action or use. <i>Marshal the troops.</i>
order	Issue commands or orders for. <i>She ordered me to leave.</i>
organize	Bring order and organization to. <i>The soul doth organize the body.</i>
range	Have a range be capable of projecting over a certain distance as of a gun. <i>The instruments ranged from tuba to cymbals.</i>
rate	Have a high opinion of. <i>The hotel rated four star had no hot water.</i>
set out	Give a fine, sharp edge to a knife or razor.
sort	Resolve (a problem or difficulty). <i>The mail was sorted.</i>

structure	Give a structure to. <i>Services must be structured so as to avoid pitfalls.</i>
systematize	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system. <i>Systematize our scientific knowledge.</i>
systemize	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system.
tabulate	Arrange or enter in tabular form. <i>The system is designed to enable users to extract analyse and tabulate data.</i>

deployment	The distribution of forces in preparation for battle or work. <i>A world leader in the development and deployment of wave and tidal power.</i>
<u>encode</u>	Convert information into code. <i>The amount of time required to encode a wav file to mp3 format.</i>
<u>format</u>	Set printed matter into a specific format. <i>A data file in binary format.</i>
institute	An organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession. <i>The state instituted a national lottery.</i>
<u>orchestrate</u>	Write an orchestra score for. <i>The song cycle was stunningly arranged and orchestrated.</i>
orchestration	The act of arranging a piece of music for an orchestra and assigning parts to the different musical instruments. <i>The skillful orchestration of his political campaign.</i>
order	The insignia worn by members of an order of honour or merit. <i>An explosion of a low order of magnitude.</i>
ordering	The act of putting things in a sequential arrangement. <i>There were mistakes in the ordering of items on the list.</i>
<u>organize</u>	Form or join a union. <i>She was unsuited to anything where she had to organize herself.</i>
pigeonhole	Put a document in a pigeonhole. <i>She pigeonholed her worry about him.</i>
placement	The spatial property of the way in which something is placed. <i>Students spend one year on industrial placement.</i>
<u>prepare</u>	Prepare for eating by applying heat. <i>She took time off to prepare for her exams.</i>
rank	Assign a rank or rating to. <i>He now ranks third in America.</i>
<u>redefine</u>	Give a new or different definition to. <i>She redefined his duties.</i>
regularize	Make regular or more regular. <i>Regularize the heart beat with a pace maker.</i>
relocation	The action of moving to a new place and establishing one's home or business there. <i>The planned relocation of national headquarters to Warwickshire.</i>

reorganize	Change the way in which (something) is organized. <i>We must reorganize the company if we don't want to go under.</i>
setup	Equipment designed to serve a specific function. <i>It takes time to learn the setup around here.</i>
sizing	Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
systematize	Arrange according to an organized system; make systematic. <i>Systematize our scientific knowledge.</i>
variously	In several or different ways. <i>The alternatives that are variously represented by the participants.</i>
