dispose	Arrange in a particular position. She dispose d of her parents possessions.
<u>file</u>	File a formal charge against. The contract when signed is file d.
grade	Arrange in or allocate to grades classify or sort. <i>Grade</i> tests.
group	Form a group or group together. Growers began to group together to form cooperatives.
<u>index</u>	List in an index. The pins are retracted and index ed to occupy an adjacent slotted position.
list	Be on a list of products at a specified price. Local offices are list ed in the phone book.
<u>log</u>	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. Control room staff resorted to using pen and paper to log calls.
marshal	Make ready for action or use. <i>Marshal</i> the troops.
order	Issue commands or orders for. She order ed me to leave.
<u>organize</u>	Bring order and organization to. The soul doth organize the body.
range	Have a range be capable of projecting over a certain distance as of a gun. The instruments range d from tuba to cymbals.
rate	Have a high opinion of. The hotel rate d four star had no hot water.
set out	Give a fine, sharp edge to a knife or razor.
sort	Resolve (a problem or difficulty. The mail was sort ed.



structure	Give a structure to. Services must be structure d so as to avoid pitfalls.
systematize	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system. <i>Systematize</i> our scientific knowledge.
systemize	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system.
tabulate	Arrange or enter in tabular form. The system is designed to enable users to extract analyse and tabulate data.
