<b>compile</b>	Use a computer program to translate source code written in a particular programming language into computer-readable machine code that can be executed. <i><b>Compile</b> a list.</i>
<b>dispose</b>	Arrange in a particular position. <i>She <b>disposed</b> of her parents possessions.</i>
<b>file</b>	File a formal charge against. <i>The contract when signed is <b>filed</b>.</i>
<b>grade</b>	Arrange in or allocate to grades classify or sort. <i><b>Grade</b> tests.</i>
<b>group</b>	Form a group or group together. <i>Growers began to <b>group</b> together to form cooperatives.</i>
<b>index</b>	List in an index. <i>The pins are retracted and <b>indexed</b> to occupy an adjacent slotted position.</i>
<b>list</b>	Be on a list of products at a specified price. <i>Local offices are <b>listed</b> in the phone book.</i>
<b>log</b>	Enter into a log as on ships and planes. <i>Control room staff resorted to using pen and paper to <b>log</b> calls.</i>
<b>marshal</b>	Make ready for action or use. <i><b>Marshal</b> the troops.</i>
<b>order</b>	Issue commands or orders for. <i>She <b>ordered</b> me to leave.</i>
<b>organize</b>	Bring order and organization to. <i>The soul doth <b>organize</b> the body.</i>
<b>range</b>	Have a range be capable of projecting over a certain distance as of a gun. <i>The instruments <b>ranged</b> from tuba to cymbals.</i>
<b>rate</b>	Have a high opinion of. <i>The hotel <b>rated</b> four star had no hot water.</i>
<b>set out</b>	Give a fine, sharp edge to a knife or razor.
<b>sort</b>	Resolve (a problem or difficulty). <i>The mail was <b>sorted</b>.</i>

<b>structure</b>	Give a structure to. <i>Services must be <b>structured</b> so as to avoid pitfalls.</i>
<b>systematize</b>	Arrange according to a system or reduce to a system. <i><b>Systematize</b> our scientific knowledge.</i>

<b>deployment</b>	The distribution of forces in preparation for battle or work. <i>A world leader in the development and <b>deployment</b> of wave and tidal power.</i>
<b><u>encode</u></b>	Convert information into code. <i>The amount of time required to <b>encode</b> a wav file to mp3 format.</i>
<b><u>format</u></b>	Set printed matter into a specific format. <i>A data file in binary <b>format</b>.</i>
<b>institute</b>	An organization having a particular purpose, especially one that is involved with science, education, or a specific profession. <i>The state <b>instituted</b> a national lottery.</i>
<b><u>orchestrate</u></b>	Write an orchestra score for. <i>The song cycle was stunningly arranged and <b>orchestrated</b>.</i>
<b>orchestration</b>	The act of arranging a piece of music for an orchestra and assigning parts to the different musical instruments. <i>The skillful <b>orchestration</b> of his political campaign.</i>
<b>order</b>	The insignia worn by members of an order of honour or merit. <i>An explosion of a low <b>order</b> of magnitude.</i>
<b>ordering</b>	The act of putting things in a sequential arrangement. <i>There were mistakes in the <b>ordering</b> of items on the list.</i>
<b><u>organize</u></b>	Form or join a union. <i>She was unsuited to anything where she had to <b>organize</b> herself.</i>
<b>pigeonhole</b>	Put a document in a pigeonhole. <i>She <b>pigeonholed</b> her worry about him.</i>

<b>regularize</b>	Make regular or more regular. <i><b>Regularize</b> the heart beat with a pace maker.</i>
