With a faint light; not brightly. A <b>dimly</b> lit room.
Having or showing knowledge of a subject or situation. Obtaining <b>informed</b> consent from research participants is central to ethical research practice.
A slight suggestion or vague understanding. The records give us an <b>inkling</b> of how people saw the world.
The fact of being aware of information that is known to few people. A man who had <b>know</b> n better times.
The psychological result of perception and learning and reasoning. <i>He denied all</i> <b>knowledge</b> of the incidents.
The area of cognitive psychology that studies memory processes. <i>He can do it from <b>memory</b>.</i>
Inclined or willing to do something. Ever <b>mindful</b> of her health.

receptiveness	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas. <i>He was testing the government s <b>receptiveness</b> to reform.</i>
recognize	Perceive to be the same. Julia hardly <b>recognize</b> d Jill when they met.
retentive	(of a substance) able to absorb and hold moisture. <i>He had a highly</i> <b>retentive</b> <i>memory and was an accomplished speaker.</i>
semiconscious	Partially conscious; not completely aware of sensations.
sensate	Perceiving or perceived by the senses. <i>Sensate</i> creatures.
<u>sensitive</u>	Easily offended or upset. I suppose I shouldn t be so <b>sensitive</b> .
<u>sentient</u>	Endowed with feeling and unstructured consciousness- T.E.Lawrence. <i>The living knew themselves just</i> <b>sentient</b> <i>puppets on God s stage.</i>
subconsciously	From the subconscious mind. Maybe <b>subconsciously</b> I was trying to sabotage the deal.
wakefulness	The process of paying close and continuous attention. <i>Wakefulness</i> watchfulness and bellicosity make a good hunter.
waking	The state of being awake. <i>He hangs between sleeping and <b>waking</b>.</i>
wary	Marked by keen caution and watchful prudence. They were <b>wary</b> in their movements.
