<b>homogenized</b>	Formed by blending unlike elements especially by reducing one element to particles and dispersing them throughout another substance. <i>A <b>homogenized</b> society.</i>
<b>joined</b>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other.
<b><u>logical</u></b>	Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts. <i>Rain was a <b>logical</b> expectation given the time of year.</i>
<b><u>lucid</u></b>	(of a dream) experienced with the dreamer feeling awake, aware of dreaming, and able to control events consciously. <i>A <b>lucid</b> moment in his madness.</i>
<b>merged</b>	Formed or united into a whole.
<b>meshed</b>	(of a geometric object) represented by an arrangement of a finite number of geometric components. <i>Fine <b>meshed</b> sieves.</i>
<b>ordered</b>	Having a systematic arrangement; especially having elements succeeding in order according to rule. <i>An <b>ordered</b> sequence.</i>
<b>rational</b>	Consistent with or based on or using reason. <i><b>Rational</b> numbers.</i>
<b>reasonable</b>	As much as is appropriate or fair; moderate. <i>It seems a <b>reasonable</b> enough request.</i>
<b>reasoned</b>	Based on logic or good sense. <i>A <b>reasoned</b> judgement.</i>
<b>sound</b>	Complete; thorough. <i><b>Sound</b> advice.</i>
<b>tenacious</b>	Stubbornly unyielding. <i>A mind not gifted to discover truth but <b>tenacious</b> to hold it.</i>
<b><u>unified</u></b>	Made uniform or whole; united. <i>A <b>unified</b> system of national education.</i>
<b><u>united</u></b>	Of or relating to two people who are married to each other. <i>Women acting together in a <b>united</b> way.</i>
<b>well reasoned</b>	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

<u>nonstop</u>	Occurring without stops. <i>How many <b>nonstops</b> are there to Dallas.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Never ending or changing. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>
<b>qualitatively</b>	In a qualitative manner. <i>Security levels can be <b>qualitatively</b> assessed.</i>
<b>seamless</b>	(of a fabric or surface) smooth and without seams or obvious joins. <i>The <b>seamless</b> integration of footage from different sources.</i>
<u>steadily</u>	In a controlled or unwavering manner. <i>The mountain got <b>steadily</b> steeper.</i>
<b>sustained</b>	Continuing for an extended period or without interruption. <i>Several years of <b>sustained</b> economic growth.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Not coming to an end; continuous. <i>The <b>unceasing</b> efforts of the staff.</i>
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not changeable or subject to change. <i>A fixed and <b>unchangeable</b> part of the germ plasm.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Showing little if any change. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
