Allow to have.

### agree

Reach agreement about something after negotiation.

*We **agreed** on the terms of the settlement.*

### **be compatible**

Have an existence, be extant.

### **be concurrent**

Form or compose.

### **be consistent**

Happen, occur, take place.

### **be in agreement**

Be priced at.

### **be in tune**

Represent, as of a character on stage.

### **co-occur**

Go with, fall together.

Coexist peacefully as of nations.

### coexist

*Dwarf mammoths may have survived in north east Siberia to **coexist** with the Egyptian pharaohs.*

Happen simultaneously.

### **concur**

*In tests cytogenetic determination has been found to **concur** with enzymatic determination.*

Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.

### conform

*The changes were introduced to **conform** with international classifications.*

### **cooccur**

Go with, fall together.

To bear a reciprocal or mutual relation.

### correlate

*We should **correlate** general trends in public opinion with trends in the content of television news.*

Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics.

### correspond

*The doctor and I **corresponded** for more than two decades.*

Fit together tightly as if by means of a dovetail.

### **dovetail**

*Plan to enable parents to **dovetail** their career and family commitments.*

### equate

Be equivalent or parallel, in mathematics.

*Customers **equate** their name with quality.*

### **fit**

Be the right size or shape fit correctly or as desired.

*Can you **fit** the toy into the box.*

### **happen at the same time**

Happen, occur, or be the case in the course of events or by chance (Santayana).

**happen together**

Chance to be or do something, without intention or causation.

**harmonize**

Produce a pleasing visual combination.

*The colors don't **harmonize**.*

**match**

Make equal uniform corresponding or matching.

*His anger **matched** her own.*

**occur simultaneously**

Come to pass.

**tally**

Calculate the total number of.

*Their signatures should **tally** with their names on the register.*



## Usage Examples of "Coincide" as a verb

- *The interests of employers and employees do not always coincide.*
- *Our views on this matter coincided.*
- *On Friday afternoons we generally coincided.*
- *The two events coincided.*
- *The two long-distance walks briefly coincide here.*
- *Publication is timed to coincide with a major exhibition.*

<a href="#"><u>agree</u></a>	Be in accord be in agreement. <i>No two of my colleagues would <b>agree</b> on whom to elect chairman.</i>
<b>allow</b>	Allow the presence of or allow an activity without opposing or prohibiting. <i>They agreed to a ceasefire to <b>allow</b> talks with the government.</i>
<b>assent</b>	Official agreement or sanction. <i>Guest house then Frank <b>assented</b> cheerfully.</i>

<b>concur</b>	Happen or occur at the same time; coincide. <i>In tests cytogenetic determination has been found to <b>concur</b> with enzymatic determination.</i>
<b>concurrent</b>	Existing, happening, or done at the same time. <i>He received <b>concurrent</b> sentences of two years imprisonment for each of his two convictions.</i>
<b><u>conform</u></b>	Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions. <i>The pressure to <b>conform</b>.</i>
<b>conformance</b>	Correspondence in form or appearance. <i><b>Conformance</b> testing.</i>
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Give permission for something to happen. <i>He indicated his <b>consent</b>.</i>
<b><u>correspond</u></b>	Exchange messages. <i>Communication is successful when the ideas in the minds of the speaker and hearer <b>correspond</b>.</i>
<b><u>fortuitous</u></b>	Having no cause or apparent cause. <i>Profits were enhanced by a <b>fortuitous</b> drop in the cost of raw materials.</i>
<b><u>fortunate</u></b>	Favoured by or involving good luck; lucky. <i>A <b>fortunate</b> choice.</i>
<b>hap</b>	An accidental happening. <i>If you have the good <b>hap</b> to come into their houses.</i>
<b>happenstance</b>	Coincidence. <i>It was just <b>happenstance</b> that I happened to be there.</i>
<b><u>inadvertently</u></b>	Without knowledge or intention. <i>His name had been <b>inadvertently</b> omitted from the list.</i>
<b>incidental</b>	An incidental expense event etc. <i>Labor problems <b>incidental</b> to a rapid expansion.</i>
<b>incidentally</b>	Of a minor or subordinate nature. <i>The infection was discovered only <b>incidentally</b> at post mortem examination.</i>
<b>ineluctable</b>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An <b>ineluctable</b> destiny.</i>
<b><u>inevitable</u></b>	Invariably occurring or appearing. <i>The <b>inevitable</b> result.</i>
<b><u>inevitably</u></b>	As one would expect; predictably. <i><b>Inevitably</b> the phone started to ring just as we sat down.</i>

<b><u>necessarily</u></b>	In an essential manner. <i>The prognosis can <b>necessarily</b> be only an educated guess.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Come to pass. <i>Nothing <b>occurred</b> that seemed important.</i>
<b>perforce</b>	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs <b>perforce</b> have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<b><u>simultaneous</u></b>	Occurring, operating, or done at the same time. <i>A <b>simultaneous</b> withdrawal of troops.</i>
<b>simultaneously</b>	At the same instant. <i>It works <b>simultaneously</b> as character study teen drama and sci fi thriller.</i>
<b>synchronism</b>	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
<b>together</b>	In contact with each other or in proximity. <i>She looks a very <b>together</b> young woman.</i>
<b><u>unavoidable</u></b>	Not able to be avoided, prevented, or ignored; inevitable. <i>The natural and <b>unavoidable</b> consequences of growing old.</i>
<b><u>unintended</u></b>	Not deliberate. <i>The <b>unintended</b> consequences of people s actions.</i>
