Definitions of "Coincidental" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "coincidental" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Happening or existing at the same time.
- Resulting from a coincidence; happening by chance.
- Occurring or operating at the same time.

Synonyms of "Coincidental" as an adjective (19 Words)

accidental	(in Aristotelian thought) relating to or denoting properties which are not essential to a thing's nature. <i>An accidental shooting.</i>
adventitious	Coming from outside; not native. <i>The adventitious population.</i>
aleatory	Dependent on chance. A photograph can capture the aleatory chaos of modern urban life.



<u>casual</u>	Done or acting in a desultory way. A casual remark.
chance	Occurring or appearing or singled out by chance. A chance occurrence.
co-occurrent	Occurring or operating at the same time.
coexistent	Existing at the same time. Coexistent with the excitement is plenty of well earned scepticism.
coincident	Occurring together in space or time. A series of coincident events.
coinciding	Occurring or operating at the same time.
<u>concomitant</u>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. She loved travel with all its concomitant worries.
concurrent	(of two or more prison sentences) to be served at the same time. There are three concurrent art fairs around the city.
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Occurring in the same period of time. A rise in interest rates is often contemporaneous with an increase in inflation.
cooccurring	Occurring or operating at the same time.
fluky	Obtained or achieved more by chance than skill. A fluky wind.
<u>fortuitous</u>	Occurring by happy chance. The ball went into the goal by a fortuitous ricochet.
random	Made, done, or happening without method or conscious decision. Are you going to take some random guy on Twitter s word.
<u>serendipitous</u>	Lucky in making unexpected and fortunate discoveries. A serendipitous encounter.
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>Simultaneous</i> translation.
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase. Recovery was synchronous with therapy.

Usage Examples of "Coincidental" as an adjective

- Any resemblance between their reports is purely coincidental.
- It's convenient that his plan is coincidental with the group's closure.



Associations of "Coincidental" (30 Words)

automatically	(with reference to a firearm) continuously until the ammunition is exhausted or the pressure on the trigger is released. <i>The kettle automatically switched off when it boiled.</i>
coeval	A person of nearly the same age as another. Like so many of his coeval s he yearned for stability.
coexisting	Existing at the same time.
<u>coincide</u>	Correspond in nature; tally. The two long distance walks briefly coincide here.
<u>coincidence</u>	The fact of corresponding in nature or in time of occurrence. It was a coincidence that she was wearing a jersey like Laura s.
coincident	Occurring together in space or time. <i>A series of coincident events.</i>
<u>concomitant</u>	Following or accompanying as a consequence. Concomitant with his obsession with dirt was a desire for order.
concurrent	Agreeing or consistent. She was given nine months concurrent for each offence.
concurrently	At the same time; simultaneously. Journal articles published concurrently with the exhibition.
<u>congruent</u>	(of figures) identical in form; coinciding exactly when superimposed. Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent .
<u>contemporaneous</u>	Of the same period. Pythagoras was contemporaneous with Buddha.
<u>contemporary</u>	Living or occurring at the same time. The composer Salieri was contemporary with Mozart.
<u>cooperative</u>	Involving the joint activity of two or more. Every member has clearly defined tasks in a cooperative enterprise.
<u>equalize</u>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. Britain is required to equalize pension rights between men and women.
<u>equate</u>	Make equal, uniform, corresponding, or matching. That sum equate s to half a million pounds today.
exist	Have an existence be extant. <i>He could barely exist on such a low wage.</i>
<u>fortuitous</u>	Happening by a lucky chance; fortunate. <i>Fortuitous</i> encounters strange accidents of fortune.



hap	An accidental happening. Where er I hap p d to roam.
happenstance	Coincidence. An untoward happenstance for Trudy.
incidental	An incidental expense event etc. Confusion incidental to a quick change.
modern	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Modern</i> history.
oscillate	(of a circuit or device) cause the electric current or voltage running through it to vary in magnitude or position in a regular manner about a central point. <i>The grain pan near the front of the combine</i> oscillate <i>s</i> back and forth.
recent	Approximately the last 10,000 years. A recent issue of the journal.
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. A simultaneous withdrawal of troops.
simultaneously	At the same instant. The telethon was broadcast simultaneously on 31 US networks.
<u>sync</u>	Synchronization. The flash needs to be sync ed to your camera.
synchronism	The relation that exists when things occur at the same time.
<u>synchronize</u>	Coordinate; combine. <i>Synchronize</i> your watches.
synchronous	Occurring or existing at the same time or having the same period or phase- Jour.A.M.A. <i>Synchronous</i> oscillations.
timing	(in an internal combustion engine) the times when the valves open and close, and the time of the ignition spark, in relation to the movement of the piston in the cylinder. One of the secrets of cricket is good timing .
