Associations of "Coined" (30 Words)

anna	A former copper coin of Pakistan and India.
bicentennial	The two-hundredth anniversary of a significant event. <i>Bicentennial celebration.</i>
briefcase	A case with a handle; for carrying papers or files or books.
bus	Send or move around by bus. <i>The priest bussed in from a neighbouring parish.</i>
cent	A small sum of money. <i>The pound is down two cents at one dollar forty.</i>
coinage	The act of inventing a word or phrase. <i>The word is of Derrida s own coinage.</i>
collectible	Subject to or requiring payment especially as specified. <i>A collectible bill.</i>
collecting	The act of gathering something together.
commemorative	Acting as a memorial of an event or person. <i>A commemorative plaque.</i>
currency	The metal or paper medium of exchange that is presently used. <i>The dollar was a strong currency.</i>
dime	A small amount of money. <i>There s not a dime s worth of difference between you and him.</i>
dollar	A United States coin worth one dollar. <i>The dollar coin has never been popular in the United States.</i>
drachma	A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
keepsake	A small item kept in memory of the person who gave it or originally owned it. <i>She was wearing the medal he gave her as a keepsake.</i>

medal	Decorate or honour with a medal. <i>They medalled in all the relay events.</i>
<u>minimum</u>	The least possible. <i>They checked visas with the minimum of fuss.</i>
neologism	A newly coined word or expression.
numismatist	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
obelisk	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
paperback	(of a book) bound in stiff paper or flexible card. <i>The shelves were stacked with well thumbed paperbacks.</i>
penny	A small sum of money. <i>We didn't get paid a penny.</i>
pickpocket	Steal from the pockets of (someone). <i>I think someone pickpocketed me in Brighton on my way to the station.</i>
pucker	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She puckered her lips.</i>
<u>purse</u>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>Institutions are funded from the same general purse.</i>
<u>souvenir</u>	Take as a memento. <i>Many parts of the aircraft have been souvenired.</i>
stamp	A mark or pattern made by a stamp especially one indicating official validation. <i>The whole place is mine which means I can stamp my personality on it.</i>
sterling	British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK. <i>Prices in sterling are shown.</i>
<u>ticket</u>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. <i>He stood for office on a strong right wing no nonsense ticket.</i>
<u>token</u>	Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal. <i>The patronizing treatment of the token Middle Eastern character.</i>
wallet	A pocket-size case for holding papers and paper money.
