## Associations of "Coined" (30 Words)

<b>anna</b>	A former copper coin of Pakistan and India.
<b>bicentennial</b>	The two-hundredth anniversary of a significant event. <i><b>Bicentennial</b> celebration.</i>
<a href="#">briefcase</a>	A case with a handle; for carrying papers or files or books.
<b>bus</b>	Send or move around by bus. <i>The priest <b>bussed</b> in from a neighbouring parish.</i>
<b>cent</b>	A small sum of money. <i>The pound is down two <b>cents</b> at one dollar forty.</i>
<b>coinage</b>	The act of inventing a word or phrase. <i>The word is of Derrida s own <b>coinage</b>.</i>
<a href="#">collectible</a>	Subject to or requiring payment especially as specified. <i>A <b>collectible</b> bill.</i>
<b>collecting</b>	The act of gathering something together.
<b>commemorative</b>	Acting as a memorial of an event or person. <i>A <b>commemorative</b> plaque.</i>
<a href="#">currency</a>	The metal or paper medium of exchange that is presently used. <i>The dollar was a strong <b>currency</b>.</i>
<b>dime</b>	A small amount of money. <i>There s not a <b>dime</b> s worth of difference between you and him.</i>
<b>dollar</b>	A United States coin worth one dollar. <i>The <b>dollar</b> coin has never been popular in the United States.</i>
<b>drachma</b>	A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
<b>keepsake</b>	A small item kept in memory of the person who gave it or originally owned it. <i>She was wearing the medal he gave her as a <b>keepsake</b>.</i>

<b>medal</b>	Decorate or honour with a medal. <i>They <b>medalled</b> in all the relay events.</i>
<b><u>minimum</u></b>	The least possible. <i>They checked visas with the <b>minimum</b> of fuss.</i>
<b>neologism</b>	A newly coined word or expression.
<b>numismatist</b>	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
<b>obelisk</b>	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
<b>paperback</b>	(of a book) bound in stiff paper or flexible card. <i>The shelves were stacked with well thumbed <b>paperbacks</b>.</i>
<b>penny</b>	A small sum of money. <i>We didn't get paid a <b>penny</b>.</i>
<b>pickpocket</b>	Steal from the pockets of (someone). <i>I think someone <b>pickpocketed</b> me in Brighton on my way to the station.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>She <b>puckered</b> her lips.</i>
<b><u>purse</u></b>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. <i>Institutions are funded from the same general <b>purse</b>.</i>
<b><u>souvenir</u></b>	Take as a memento. <i>Many parts of the aircraft have been <b>souvenired</b>.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	A mark or pattern made by a stamp especially one indicating official validation. <i>The whole place is mine which means I can <b>stamp</b> my personality on it.</i>
<b>sterling</b>	British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK. <i>Prices in <b>sterling</b> are shown.</i>
<b><u>ticket</u></b>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. <i>He stood for office on a strong right wing no nonsense <b>ticket</b>.</i>
<b><u>token</u></b>	Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal. <i>The patronizing treatment of the <b>token</b> Middle Eastern character.</i>
<b>wallet</b>	A pocket-size case for holding papers and paper money.
