## Associations of "Coins" (30 Words)

<b>anna</b>	A former copper coin of Pakistan and India.
<b>bicentennial</b>	The 200th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The <b>bicentennial</b> celebrations.</i>
<b><u>briefcase</u></b>	A leather or plastic rectangular container with a handle for carrying books and documents.
<b>bus</b>	Ride in a bus. <i>Staff were <b>bussed</b> in and out of the factory.</i>
<b>cent</b>	A fractional monetary unit of several countries. <i>The pound is down two <b>cents</b> at one dollar forty.</i>
<b>coinage</b>	The act of inventing a word or phrase. <i>Decimal <b>coinage</b>.</i>

<b><u>collectible</u></b>	Things considered to be worth collecting (not necessarily valuable or antique. A <b>collectible</b> bill.
<b>collecting</b>	The act of gathering something together.
<b>commemorative</b>	An object such as a stamp or coin made to mark an event or honour a person. A <b>commemorative</b> plaque.
<b><u>currency</u></b>	The metal or paper medium of exchange that is presently used. The <b>currency</b> of ideas.
<b>dime</b>	A ten-cent coin. There s not a <b>dime</b> s worth of difference between you and him.
<b>dollar</b>	A piece of paper money worth one dollar. He worships the almighty <b>dollar</b> .
<b>drachma</b>	A unit of apothecary weight equal to an eighth of an ounce or to 60 grains.
<b>keepsake</b>	A small item kept in memory of the person who gave it or originally owned it. She was wearing the medal he gave her as a <b>keepsake</b> .
<b>medal</b>	Win a medal in a sporting event. He was <b>medalled</b> by the Michigan Photographers Association.
<b><u>minimum</u></b>	The point on a curve where the tangent changes from negative on the left to positive on the right. They checked visas with the <b>minimum</b> of fuss.
<b>neologism</b>	A newly coined word or expression.
<b>numismatist</b>	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular.
<b>obelisk</b>	A mountain tree or other natural object resembling an obelisk in shape.
<b>paperback</b>	Having a flexible binding. The shelves were stacked with well thumbed <b>paperbacks</b> .
<b>penny</b>	A one-cent coin. We didn t get paid a <b>penny</b> .
<b>pickpocket</b>	A person who steals from people's pockets. I think someone <b>pickpocketed</b> me in Brighton on my way to the station.
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. The child s face <b>puckered</b> ready to cry.
<b><u>purse</u></b>	A sum of money spoken of as the contents of a money purse. The <b>purse</b> barely covered the winner s expenses.

<b><u>souvenir</u></b>	Take as a memento. <i>The recording provides a <b>souvenir</b> of a great production.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	An act or sound of stamping with the foot. <i>More men of his <b>stamp</b> are needed.</i>
<b>sterling</b>	British money especially the pound sterling as the basic monetary unit of the UK. <i>Issues of <b>sterling</b> bonds.</i>
<b><u>ticket</u></b>	Provide with a ticket for passage or admission. <i>He stood for office on a strong right wing no nonsense <b>ticket</b>.</i>
<b><u>token</u></b>	Insignificantly small a matter of form only tokenish is informal. <i>You should have a <b>token</b> that will stand you in good stead if ever you should fall foul of the prince s officers.</i>
<b>wallet</b>	A pocket-sized flat folding case for holding money and plastic cards.
