### **Definitions of "Collage" as a noun**

- *The art of making collages.*
- *A piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.*

## Associations of "Collage" (30 Words)

<b>art</b>	The products of human creativity works of art collectively. <i>A collection of fine <b>art</b>.</i>
<b>artist</b>	A person who habitually practises a specified reprehensible activity. <i>Rip off <b>artists</b>.</i>
<b>artwork</b>	Illustrations, photographs, or other non-textual material prepared for inclusion in a publication. <i>The technology can produce finished <b>artwork</b> for anything from press ads to corporate brochures.</i>
<b>calligrapher</b>	Someone skilled in penmanship.
<b>cartoonist</b>	An artist who draws cartoons. <i>A political <b>cartoonist</b> for the local newspaper.</i>
<b>chiaroscuro</b>	The treatment of light and shade in drawing and painting. <i>The <b>chiaroscuro</b> of cobbled streets.</i>
<b>choreographer</b>	A person who composes the sequence of steps and moves for a performance of dance. <i>A professional <b>choreographer</b>.</i>



<b>cinematic</b>	Having qualities characteristic of films. <i><b>Cinematic</b> output.</i>
<b>draft</b>	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>He was <b>drafted</b> in 1938.</i>
<b>exhibitor</b>	A person who displays works of art or other items of interest at an exhibition. <i>The trade fair attracted 89 <b>exhibitors</b> and 37 000 visitors.</i>
<b>fresco</b>	Paint in fresco. <i>Four scenes had been <b>frescoed</b> on the wall.</i>
<b>futurist</b>	A theologian who believes that the Scripture prophecies of the Apocalypse (the Book of Revelation) will be fulfilled in the future. <i>The grim urban setting of the novel would have been a <b>futurist</b> nightmare.</i>
<u><b>gallery</b></u>	A collection of pictures. <i>In the minstrels <b>gallery</b> a string orchestra plays themes from film soundtracks.</i>
<b>gouache</b>	A picture painted using the gouache method.
<b>illustrator</b>	A person who draws or creates pictures for magazines, books, advertising, etc.
<b>literary</b>	Of language associated with literary works or other formal writing having a marked style intended to create a particular emotional effect. <i>The newspaper's <b>literary</b> editor.</i>
<b>literature</b>	The humanistic study of a body of literature. <i>The technical <b>literature</b>.</i>
<u><b>masterpiece</b></u>	A work of outstanding artistry, skill, or workmanship. <i>A great literary <b>masterpiece</b>.</i>
<b>modernist</b>	A believer in or supporter of modernism, especially in the arts. <i>His early work explored all manner of <b>modernist</b> styles.</i>
<b>montage</b>	A sequence of film made using the technique of montage. <i>The art of <b>montage</b> in theatre and film.</i>
<u><b>mosaic</b></u>	A pattern resembling a mosaic. <i>He <b>mosaicked</b> the walls ceilings and floors.</i>
<b>mural</b>	Relating to or resembling a wall. <i><b>Mural</b> thrombosis.</i>
<u><b>novel</b></u>	The literary genre represented or exemplified by novels. <i>He burned all the <b>novels</b>.</i>

**painting** The act of applying paint to a surface.  
*House **painting** was the only craft he knew.*

**photo** A photograph.  
*Do we wait till you've had him **photoed**.*

**photocopy** Make a photocopy of.  
*You can **photocopy** the entry form.*

**photographer** Someone who takes photographs professionally.  
*A freelance press **photographer**.*

**picture** Represent in a photograph or picture.  
*She had her **picture** painted.*

**poesy** The art or composition of poetry.  
*The genius of **poesy**.*

**portrayal** Any likeness of a person, in any medium.  
*A realistic **portrayal** of war.*
