<b>ceramic</b>	The material from which ceramics are made. <i>Tableware in <b>ceramic</b>.</i>
<b><u>coin</u></b>	Money in the form of coins. <i>Gold and silver <b>coins</b>.</i>
<b>collect</b>	Gather or collect. <i>A small crowd <b>collected</b> at the back door.</i>
<b>collectable</b>	Able to be collected. <i><b>Collectable</b> coins.</i>
<b>collecting</b>	The act of gathering something together.
<b>collection</b>	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>A rambling <b>collection</b> of houses.</i>
<b><u>collector</u></b>	The electrode in a transistor through which a primary flow of carriers leaves the region between the electrodes. <i>The ticket <b>collector</b> closed the gates.</i>
<b>curio</b>	Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting. <i>They had such fun over the wonderful box of <b>curios</b> that Jack had sent from India.</i>
<b>debrief</b>	Put someone through a debriefing and make him report. <i>In the <b>debrief</b> Gary gave his assessment of the trip and his performance.</i>
<b>edition</b>	Something a little different from others of the same type. <i>A paperback <b>edition</b>.</i>
<b>figurine</b>	A statuette, especially one of a human form.
<b><u>gather</u></b>	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>As soon as a crowd <b>gathered</b> the police came.</i>
<b>gathering</b>	The act of gathering something. <i>A family <b>gathering</b>.</i>
<b>miniature</b>	Painting or drawing included in a book (especially in illuminated medieval manuscripts). <i>She saw her own reflection <b>miniatured</b>.</i>
<b>numismatist</b>	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
<b>peculiarity</b>	A strange or unusual feature or habit. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British <b>peculiarity</b>.</i>

<b>porcelain</b>	An article made of porcelain. <i>A collection of Chinese <b>porcelain</b>.</i>
<b><u>rare</u></b>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind-J.R.Lowell. <i><b>Rare</b> gasses.</i>
<b>rarefied</b>	Having low density. <i>Lightheaded from the <b>rarefied</b> mountain air.</i>
<b><u>rarity</u></b>	A rare thing, especially one having particular value. <i>To take the morning off was a <b>rarity</b>.</i>
<b>scant</b>	Less than the correct or legal or full amount often deliberately so. <i>She weighed a <b>scant</b> two pounds.</i>
<b><u>scarce</u></b>	Scarcely. <i>He was <b>scarce</b> sixteen years old.</i>
<b>sparsity</b>	The property of being scanty or scattered; lacking denseness.
<b>stamp</b>	Affix a stamp to. <i>John <b>stamped</b> off muttering.</i>
<b>statuette</b>	A small statue or figurine, especially one that is smaller than life-size.
<b>valuable</b>	Extremely useful or important. <i>Put all your <b>valuables</b> in the hotel safe.</i>
<b>value</b>	Fix or determine the value of assign a value to. <i>Equipment is included up to a total <b>value</b> of 500.</i>
