- *Subject to or requiring payment especially as specified.*



Synonyms of "Collectible" as an adjective (2 Words)

collectable Able to be collected.
*A hire car **collectable** on your arrival.*

payable Able to be paid.
*A check **payable** to John Doe.*

- A collectible bill.

ancient

A person who lived in ancient times.

Ancient civilizations such as those of the Etruscans and Sumerians.

antic	A ludicrous or grotesque act done for fun and amusement. <i>Hamlet s assumed antic disposition.</i>
antique	Search or shop for antiques. <i>An antique dealer.</i>
ceramic	The material from which ceramics are made. <i>Tableware in ceramic.</i>
<u>coin</u>	Money in the form of coins. <i>Gold and silver coins.</i>
collect	Gather or collect. <i>A small crowd collected at the back door.</i>
collectable	Able to be collected. <i>Collectable coins.</i>
collecting	The act of gathering something together.
collection	A sum of money raised during a church or charity collection. <i>A rambling collection of houses.</i>
<u>collector</u>	The electrode in a transistor through which a primary flow of carriers leaves the region between the electrodes. <i>The ticket collector closed the gates.</i>
curio	Something unusual — perhaps worthy of collecting. <i>They had such fun over the wonderful box of curios that Jack had sent from India.</i>
debrief	Put someone through a debriefing and make him report. <i>In the debrief Gary gave his assessment of the trip and his performance.</i>
edition	Something a little different from others of the same type. <i>A paperback edition.</i>
figurine	A statuette, especially one of a human form.
<u>gather</u>	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>As soon as a crowd gathered the police came.</i>
gathering	The act of gathering something. <i>A family gathering.</i>
miniature	Painting or drawing included in a book (especially in illuminated medieval manuscripts). <i>She saw her own reflection miniatured.</i>
numismatist	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
peculiarity	A strange or unusual feature or habit. <i>His essays characterized decency as a British peculiarity.</i>

porcelain	An article made of porcelain. <i>A collection of Chinese porcelain.</i>
<u>rare</u>	Marked by an uncommon quality; especially superlative or extreme of its kind-J.R.Lowell. <i>Rare gasses.</i>
rarefied	Having low density. <i>Lightheaded from the rarefied mountain air.</i>
<u>rarity</u>	A rare thing, especially one having particular value. <i>To take the morning off was a rarity.</i>
scant	Less than the correct or legal or full amount often deliberately so. <i>She weighed a scant two pounds.</i>
<u>scarce</u>	Scarcely. <i>He was scarce sixteen years old.</i>
sparsity	The property of being scanty or scattered; lacking denseness.
stamp	Affix a stamp to. <i>John stamped off muttering.</i>
statuette	A small statue or figurine, especially one that is smaller than life-size.
valuable	Extremely useful or important. <i>Put all your valuables in the hotel safe.</i>
value	Fix or determine the value of assign a value to. <i>Equipment is included up to a total value of 500.</i>
