- *A crater that has collected cosmic material hitting the earth.*
- *The electrode in a transistor through which a primary flow of carriers leaves the region between the electrodes.*
- *(in some South Asian countries) the chief administrative official of a district.*
- *The region in a bipolar transistor that absorbs charge carriers.*
- *A person who is employed to collect payments (as for rent or taxes).*
- *An official who is responsible for collecting money.*
- *A person who collects things of a specified type, professionally or as a hobby.*
- *An official who collects tickets from bus or train passengers.*
- *A person who collects things.*



Synonyms of "Collector" as a noun (13 Words)

accumulator

A register used to contain the results of an arithmetical or logical operation.

*Rugs are the greatest **accumulators** of dust and dirt in every house.*

aggregator

A website or program that collects related items of content and displays them or links to them.

courier	A person who carries a message. <i>He worked as a courier on a package holiday to Majorca.</i>
errand boy	A short trip that is taken in the performance of a necessary task or mission.
forager	A person or animal that searches widely for food or provisions. <i>He is an expert forager who finds and eats healthy local ingredients growing in the wild.</i>
gatherer	A person who gathers. <i>Intelligence gatherers.</i>
<u>messenger</u>	A person who carries a message or is employed to carry messages. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.</i>
messenger boy	A person who carries a message.
niggard	A selfish person who is unwilling to give or spend.
pinchpenny	A miserly person. <i>A pinchpenny watchdog of public spending.</i>
scavenger	A person who searches for and collects discarded items. <i>A reputation as a scavenger of discarded odds and ends.</i>
scrooge	A selfish person who is unwilling to give or spend.
scrounger	A person who borrows from or lives off others. <i>Welfare scroungers.</i>

Associations of "Collector" (30 Words)

antiquary	An expert or collector of antiquities.
<u>bibliophile</u>	Someone who loves (and usually collects) books.
<u>coin</u>	Money in the form of coins. <i>Gold and silver coins.</i>
collect	Gather or collect. <i>A rider should want to be able to collect a horse when hacking.</i>
collectable	An item valued and sought by collectors. <i>A hire car collectable on your arrival.</i>
collecting	The act of gathering something together.

<u>data</u>	The quantities, characters, or symbols on which operations are performed by a computer, which may be stored and transmitted in the form of electrical signals and recorded on magnetic, optical, or mechanical recording media. <i>Statistical data.</i>
edition	A particular instance of a regular radio or television programme. <i>He read it in yesterday's edition of the Times.</i>
enthusiast	An ardent and enthusiastic supporter of some person or activity. <i>A sports car enthusiast.</i>
<u>envelope</u>	A flat paper container with a sealable flap, used to enclose a letter or document. <i>Test pilots try to push the envelope.</i>
<u>fan</u>	A thing resembling an open fan. <i>He fanned himself with his hat.</i>
fancier	A connoisseur or enthusiast of something, especially someone who has a special interest in or breeds a particular animal. <i>A pigeon fancier.</i>
<u>gather</u>	A part of a garment that is gathered. <i>She gathered her shawl around her shoulders.</i>
gatherer	A person who collects or gathers things from numerous places. <i>Nut gatherers harvest so many nuts that few if any seedlings are taking root.</i>
grape	A berry typically green purple or black growing in clusters on a grapevine eaten as fruit and used in making wine. <i>An exploration of the grape.</i>
<u>hobby</u>	An auxiliary activity. <i>Her hobbies are reading and gardening.</i>
letter	Inscribe letters or writing on. <i>Her name was lettered in gold.</i>
numismatist	A collector and student of money (and coins in particular).
passion	An irrational but irresistible motive for a belief or action. <i>Their all consuming passion for each other.</i>
pastime	A diversion that occupies one's time and thoughts (usually pleasantly). <i>His favourite pastimes were shooting and golf.</i>
philatelist	A collector and student of postage stamps.
philately	The collection and study of postage stamps.
post	A goalpost. <i>She posted a photo of herself with the singer on Twitter.</i>

pursuit	The action of the eye in following a moving object. <i>The culprit started to run and the cop took off in pursuit.</i>
selection	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>Your selection may not contain two different data types.</i>
stamp	Fix a postage stamp or stamps on to a letter. <i>He must be able to stamp his authority on the team.</i>
tatty	Tastelessly showy. <i>An old house with dirty windows and tatty curtains.</i>
vintage	A season's yield of wine from a vineyard. <i>Vintage claret.</i>
zealot	A member of an ancient Jewish sect that aimed at a world Jewish theocracy and resisted the Romans until AD 70.
zealotry	Excessive intolerance of opposing views. <i>He expressed concern about religious zealotry playing an increasing role in politics.</i>
