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Associations of "Colliding" (30 Words)

<u>bulge</u>	Bulge out form a bulge outward or be so full as to appear to bulge. <i>The telltale bulge of a concealed weapon.</i>
<u>bump</u>	In a race gain a bump against. <i>There was a bump in the number of outbound flights.</i>
clang	Make or cause to make a clang. <i>The bell of a fire engine clanged.</i>
clash	Be incompatible; be or come into conflict. <i>We play our home games when they do not clash with those of Liverpool or Everton.</i>
<u>collision</u>	A conflict between opposing ideas, interests, or factions. <i>The collision of the particles resulted in an exchange of energy and a change of direction.</i>
<u>combat</u>	Take action to reduce or prevent (something bad or undesirable). <i>We must combat the prejudices against other races.</i>
<u>compete</u>	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He competed with a number of other candidates.</i>
conflict	Be in conflict. <i>The date for the match conflicted with a religious festival.</i>
<u>confrontation</u>	A hostile disagreement face-to-face. <i>Four months of violent confrontation between government and opposition forces.</i>
crash	Cause to crash. <i>The shares crashed to 329p.</i>
crush	Crush or bruise. <i>A number of youngsters fainted in the crush.</i>

deterrent	A thing that discourages or is intended to discourage someone from doing something. <i>Britain's nuclear deterrent.</i>
discord	Be different from one another. <i>We discorded commonly on two points.</i>
displace	Take the place of or have precedence over. <i>He believes that books may be displaced by the electronic word.</i>
encounter	An unexpected or casual meeting with someone or something. <i>She felt totally unnerved by the encounter.</i>
fist	Clench the hand or fingers into a fist. <i>She pummelled him furiously with her fists.</i>
friction	The resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another. <i>A considerable amount of friction between father and son.</i>
hit	Hit with a missile from a weapon. <i>Hit a ball.</i>
irreconcilable	Any of two or more ideas or statements that cannot be made compatible. <i>Irreconcilable differences.</i>
jut	Extend out, over, or beyond the main body or line of something. <i>A rock jutted out from the side of the bank.</i>
protrusion	Something that protrudes; a protuberance. <i>A protrusion of rock jutted from the mountainside.</i>
protuberance	A thing that protrudes from something else. <i>The large size and protuberance of the incisors.</i>
relegate	Assign to a lower position; reduce in rank. <i>People argue about how to relegate certain mushrooms.</i>
rubbing	An impression of a design on brass or stone made by rubbing on paper laid over it with coloured wax pencil chalk etc. <i>Dab at the stain vigorous rubbing could damage the carpet.</i>
shatter	Upset (someone) greatly. <i>Everyone was shattered by the news.</i>
skirmish	Engage in a skirmish. <i>Protesters skirmished with a group of bystanders opposed to their march.</i>
smash	An act or sound of something smashing. <i>Their plane smashed into a mountainside.</i>
strife	Lack of agreement or harmony. <i>Strife within the community.</i>
