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## Associations of "Colliding" (30 Words)

<b><u>bulge</u></b>	Bulge out form a bulge outward or be so full as to appear to bulge. <i>The telltale <b>bulge</b> of a concealed weapon.</i>
<b><u>bump</u></b>	In a race gain a bump against. <i>There was a <b>bump</b> in the number of outbound flights.</i>
<b>clang</b>	Make or cause to make a clang. <i>The bell of a fire engine <b>clanged</b>.</i>
<b>clash</b>	Be incompatible; be or come into conflict. <i>We play our home games when they do not <b>clash</b> with those of Liverpool or Everton.</i>
<b><u>collision</u></b>	A conflict between opposing ideas, interests, or factions. <i>The <b>collision</b> of the particles resulted in an exchange of energy and a change of direction.</i>
<b><u>combat</u></b>	Take action to reduce or prevent (something bad or undesirable). <i>We must <b>combat</b> the prejudices against other races.</i>
<b><u>compete</u></b>	Compete for something engage in a contest measure oneself against others. <i>He <b>competed</b> with a number of other candidates.</i>
<b>conflict</b>	Be in conflict. <i>The date for the match <b>conflicted</b> with a religious festival.</i>
<b><u>confrontation</u></b>	A hostile disagreement face-to-face. <i>Four months of violent <b>confrontation</b> between government and opposition forces.</i>
<b>crash</b>	Cause to crash. <i>The shares <b>crashed</b> to 329p.</i>
<b>crush</b>	Crush or bruise. <i>A number of youngsters fainted in the <b>crush</b>.</i>

<b>deterrent</b>	A thing that discourages or is intended to discourage someone from doing something. <i>Britain's nuclear <b>deterrent</b>.</i>
<b>discord</b>	Be different from one another. <i>We <b>discorded</b> commonly on two points.</i>
<b>displace</b>	Take the place of or have precedence over. <i>He believes that books may be <b>displaced</b> by the electronic word.</i>
<b>encounter</b>	An unexpected or casual meeting with someone or something. <i>She felt totally unnerved by the <b>encounter</b>.</i>
<b>fist</b>	Clench the hand or fingers into a fist. <i>She pummelled him furiously with her <b>fists</b>.</i>
<b>friction</b>	The resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another. <i>A considerable amount of <b>friction</b> between father and son.</i>
<b>hit</b>	Hit with a missile from a weapon. <i><b>Hit</b> a ball.</i>
<b>irreconcilable</b>	Any of two or more ideas or statements that cannot be made compatible. <i><b>Irreconcilable</b> differences.</i>
<b>jut</b>	Extend out, over, or beyond the main body or line of something. <i>A rock <b>jutted</b> out from the side of the bank.</i>
<b>protrusion</b>	Something that protrudes; a protuberance. <i>A <b>protrusion</b> of rock jutted from the mountainside.</i>
<b>protuberance</b>	A thing that protrudes from something else. <i>The large size and <b>protuberance</b> of the incisors.</i>
<b>relegate</b>	Assign to a lower position; reduce in rank. <i>People argue about how to <b>relegate</b> certain mushrooms.</i>
<b>rubbing</b>	An impression of a design on brass or stone made by rubbing on paper laid over it with coloured wax pencil chalk etc. <i>Dab at the stain vigorous <b>rubbing</b> could damage the carpet.</i>
<b>shatter</b>	Upset (someone) greatly. <i>Everyone was <b>shattered</b> by the news.</i>
<b>skirmish</b>	Engage in a skirmish. <i>Protesters <b>skirmished</b> with a group of bystanders opposed to their march.</i>
<b>smash</b>	An act or sound of something smashing. <i>Their plane <b>smashed</b> into a mountainside.</i>
<b>strife</b>	Lack of agreement or harmony. <i><b>Strife</b> within the community.</i>
