
Collision as a Noun

Definitions of "Collision" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "collision" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A conflict between opposing ideas, interests, or factions.
- A conflict of opposed ideas or attitudes or goals.
- An instance of two or more records being assigned the same identifier or location in memory.
- A brief event in which two or more bodies come together.
- (physics) a brief event in which two or more bodies come together.
- An instance of one moving object or person striking violently against another.
- An accident resulting from violent impact of a moving object.
- An instance of simultaneous transmission by more than one node of a network.





Synonyms of "Collision" as a noun (14 Words)

<u>accident</u>	An unfortunate mishap; especially one causing damage or injury. Four people were killed in a road accident .
<u>bump</u>	A swelling on the skin, especially one caused by illness or injury. <i>The children were given the</i> bump s.
clash	An incompatibility leading to disagreement. A clash of cymbals.
conflict	An open clash between two opposing groups (or individuals)–Thomas Paine. <i>He was immobilized by</i> conflict <i>and indecision.</i>
<u>contradiction</u>	A situation in which inconsistent elements are present. The statement he is brave and he is not brave is a contradiction .
crash	A sudden failure which puts a computer system out of action. The crash of the company meant that 150 jobs would go.



<u>disagreement</u>	A difference between conflicting facts or claims or opinions. Disagreement between the results of the two assessments.
hit	A conspicuous success. Few structures can withstand a hit from a speeding car.
impact	The violent interaction of individuals or groups entering into combat. Our regional measures have had a significant impact on unemployment.
incompatibility	(immunology) the degree to which the body's immune system will try to reject foreign material (as transfused blood or transplanted tissue. <i>The incompatibility</i> between industry and nature.
knock	The sound of knocking as on a door or in an engine or bearing. The sudden knock floored him.
opposition	The major political party opposed to the party in office and prepared to replace it if elected. Despite opposition from the newspapers he went ahead.
<u>strike</u>	A pitch that passes through the strike zone. <i>The threat of nuclear strikes.</i>
<u>variance</u>	A quantity equal to the square of the standard deviation. A zoning variance .






Usage Examples of "Collision" as a noun

- A collision of interests.

<u>asteroid</u>	Relating to or denoting echinoderms of the class Asteroidea.
<u>bulge</u>	Bulge outward. The advance created an eastward facing bulge in the line.
<u>bump</u>	In a race gain a bump against. Her mosquito bites had come up in huge red bump s.
clang	Make or cause to make a clang. The steel door slammed shut with a clang .
clash	Meet and come into violent conflict. The Euro 2000 clash between England and Germany.
<u>collapse</u>	Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse. Tabulation programs can be used to collapse this list in various ways.
collide	Cause to collide. The physicists collide d the particles.
conflict	Be in conflict. Parents and children s interests sometimes conflict .
<u>confrontation</u>	Discord resulting from a clash of ideas or opinions. <i>Four months of violent</i> confrontation <i>between government and opposition forces.</i>
crash	Cause to crash. My computer crash ed last night.
damage	Inflict damage upon. The snow damage d the roof.
<u>demolish</u>	Eat up completely, as with great appetite. I looked forward keenly to demolish ing my opponent.
deterrent	A thing that discourages or is intended to discourage someone from doing something. Britain s nuclear deterrent .
<u>displace</u>	Take the place of or have precedence over. <i>He seems to have displaced some vertebrae</i> .
encounter	A confrontation or unpleasant struggle. <i>She felt totally unnerved by the encounter.</i>
excrescence	A distinct outgrowth on a body or plant, resulting from disease or abnormality. The bony excrescence between its horns.



friction	The resistance that one surface or object encounters when moving over another. <i>The friction of braking.</i>
hit	Hit with a missile from a weapon. It hit her that I wanted to settle down here.
impact	Influencing strongly. High interest rates have impact ed on retail spending.
jut	Extend out, over, or beyond the main body or line of something. She put up her head and jut ted out her chin with determination.
mangle	Press with a mangle. The car was mangle d almost beyond recognition.
protrusion	Something that protrudes; a protuberance. A protrusion of rock jutted from the mountainside.
protuberance	The fact or state of protruding. The large size and protuberance of the incisors.
<u>relegate</u>	Assign to a lower position; reduce in rank. United were relegate d to division two.
rubbing	The action of rubbing something. Dab at the stain vigorous rubbing could damage the carpet.
ruin	Destruction achieved by causing something to be wrecked or ruined. Carriages go ruin ing over the brink from time to time.
shatter	Damage or destroy (something abstract. <i>The wine glass shattered.</i>
<u>smash</u>	An act or sound of something smashing. He smash ed a 3 run homer.
vie	Compete eagerly with someone in order to do or achieve something. The athletes were vying for a place in the British team.
