## Associations of "Colonialism" (30 Words)

<b><u>activism</u></b>	The policy or action of using vigorous campaigning to bring about political or social change. <i>Growing <b>activism</b> on the abortion issue.</i>
<b><u>activist</u></b>	Advocating or engaged in activism. <i>A green leaning <b>activist</b> magazine.</i>
<b>aggressive</b>	Tending to spread quickly. <i>We needed more growth to pursue our <b>aggressive</b> acquisition strategy.</i>
<b>barbaric</b>	Without civilizing influences. <i><b>Barbaric</b> practices.</i>
<b>bellicose</b>	Demonstrating aggression and willingness to fight. <i><b>Bellicose</b> young officers.</i>
<b><u>chauvinism</u></b>	Fanatical patriotism. <i>Public opinion was easily moved to <b>chauvinism</b> and nationalism.</i>
<b>chauvinist</b>	A person with a prejudiced belief in the superiority of his or her own kind. <i>We don t want to lay ourselves open to charges that we re <b>chauvinists</b>.</i>
<b>colonize</b>	Settle among and establish control over (the indigenous people of an area). <i>The Greeks <b>colonized</b> Sicily and southern Italy.</i>
<b><u>confrontational</u></b>	Tending to deal with situations in an aggressive way; hostile or argumentative. <i>He distanced himself from the <b>confrontational</b> approach adopted by his predecessor.</i>
<b>ethnic</b>	A member of an ethnic minority. <i><b>Ethnic</b> jewellery.</i>
<b>ethnocentrism</b>	Belief in the superiority of one’s own ethnic group.

<b>ethnology</b>	The branch of anthropology that deals with the division of humankind into races and with their origins and distribution and distinctive characteristics.
<b>expansionist</b>	Of or involving or guided by expansionism. <i>He was an aggressive <b>expansionist</b>.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>hostile</b>	Impossible to bring into friendly accord. <i><b>Hostile</b> takeover.</i>
<b>invader</b>	Someone who enters by force in order to conquer. <i>It is a country that has repelled all <b>invaders</b>.</i>
<b>jingoism</b>	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. <i>The popular <b>jingoism</b> that swept the lower middle classes.</i>
<b>menacing</b>	Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening. <i>His tone became <b>menacing</b>.</i>
<b>militarism</b>	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of <b>militarism</b>.</i>
<b>nation</b>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The Shawnee <b>nation</b>.</i>
<b>nationalism</b>	The doctrine that nations should act independently (rather than collectively) to attain their goals. <i>British <b>nationalism</b> was in the air and patriotic sentiments ran high.</i>
<b>neocolonialism</b>	The use of economic, political, cultural, or other pressures to control or influence other countries, especially former dependencies.
<b>offense</b>	The team that has the ball (or puck) and is trying to score.
<b>patriotism</b>	Love of country and willingness to sacrifice for it. <i>A highly decorated officer of unquestionable integrity and <b>patriotism</b>.</i>
<b>racism</b>	Prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism by an individual, community, or institution against a person or people on the basis of their membership of a particular racial or ethnic group, typically one that is a minority or marginalized. <i>Theories of <b>racism</b>.</i>
<b>repel</b>	Be repellent to cause aversion in. <i>Like poles <b>repel</b> and unlike poles attract.</i>

**slavery**

The practice or system of owning slaves.

*He was resolved to impose a number of reforms including the abolition of **slavery**.*

**war**

A legal state created by a declaration of war and ended by official declaration during which the international rules of war apply.

***War** was declared in November but actual fighting did not begin until the following spring.*

**warlike**

Disposed towards or threatening war; hostile.

***Warlike** preparations could be made quickly.*

**xenophobia**

Dislike of or prejudice against people from other countries.

*The resurgence of racism and **xenophobia**.*
