invader Someone who enters by force in order to conquer.

jingoism An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions.

The popular **jingoism** that swept the lower middle classes.

menacing Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening.

His tone became **menacing**.

The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and

militarism be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national

interests.

The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of **militarism**.

nation The Shawnee nation.

The doctrine that nations should act independently (rather than

nationalism collectively) to attain their goals.

neocolonialism The use of economic, political, cultural, or other pressures to control or
