- colourful** Having much or varied colour; bright.

Spice from the dried aromatic bark of the Ceylon cinnamon tree used as rolled strips or ground.
A *teaspoon of ground* **cinnamon**.

color

Any material used for its color.
A white **color** is made up of many different wavelengths of light.

Favoring one person or side over another.
Colored crepe paper.

| crystallized | Having both internal structure and external form of a crystal. <i>Quartz crystal is perfectly crystallized.</i> |
| <u>iridescent</u> | Varying in color when seen in different lights or from different angles. <i>An iridescent oil slick.</i> |
| monochromatic | Having only one wavelength. <i>It employs diffraction to focus monochromatic light.</i> |
| monochrome | (of a photograph or picture, or a television screen) consisting of or displaying images in black and white or in varying tones of only one colour. |
| motley | Make motley color with different colors. <i>A motley of interacting interest groups.</i> |
| onion | The plant that produces the onion with long rolled or straplike leaves and spherical heads of greenish white flowers. <i>Cook the onion in the oil until lightly coloured.</i> |
| opalescent | Showing many small points of shifting colour against a pale or dark ground. <i>An opalescent sky.</i> |
| <u>painted</u> | Lacking substance or vitality as if produced by painting. <i>In public he wore a painted smile.</i> |
| palette | Board that provides a flat surface on which artists mix paints and the range of colors used. <i>Our Essential Eyes palette has eight mix and match shades.</i> |
| pep | Make someone or something more lively or interesting. <i>This tonic is guaranteed to give you more pep.</i> |
| <u>picturesque</u> | (of language) unusual and vivid. <i>Ruined abbeys and picturesque villages.</i> |
| piebald | A piebald horse. <i>A piebald horse.</i> |
| pied | Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>Pied daisies.</i> |
| polychrome | Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>A precious polychrome ikon.</i> |
| <u>rainbow</u> | An arch of colours visible in the sky caused by the refraction and dispersion of the sun's light by rain or other water droplets in the atmosphere. The colours of the rainbow are generally said to be red orange yellow green blue indigo and violet. <i>A rainbow of medals decorated his chest.</i> |

| <u>vanilla</u> | Flavored with vanilla extract. <i>The original vanilla MP3 format is still the most commonly encountered form of the technology.</i> |
| <u>various</u> | Distinctly dissimilar or unlike. <i>Dresses of various colours.</i> |
| <u>vibrant</u> | (of sound) strong or resonating. <i>A vibrant cosmopolitan city.</i> |
| <u>vivid</u> | Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. <i>The rhododendron bush provides a vivid splash of mauve.</i> |
| wonderful | Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was wonderful all the year round.</i> |
