| colored | Having skin rich in melanin pigments. <i>Colored crepe paper.</i> |

| discolor | Lose color or turn colorless. <i>The painting discolored.</i> |
| dye | Add a colour to or change the colour of something by soaking it in a solution impregnated with a dye. <i>A black dye.</i> |
| hue | The quality of a color as determined by its dominant wavelength. <i>The water is the deepest hue of aquamarine.</i> |
| iridescent | Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>The drake s head has an iridescent purple sheen.</i> |
| monochromatic | (of light or other radiation) of a single wavelength or frequency. <i>It employs diffraction to focus monochromatic light.</i> |
| monochrome | Having or appearing to have only one color. |
| motley | A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A motley crew.</i> |
| opalescent | Showing many small points of shifting colour against a pale or dark ground. <i>A milky opalescent or opaline luster.</i> |
| orange | Used in names of plants with similar fruit or flowers to the orange tree e g mock orange. <i>Orange juice.</i> |
| paint | Basketball a space including the foul line in front of the basket at each end of a basketball court usually painted a different color from the rest of the court. <i>The program enables you to paint images on your screen.</i> |
| painted | Coated with paint. <i>Freshly painted lawn furniture.</i> |
| palette | One of the rounded armor plates at the armpits of a suit of armor. <i>He commands the sort of tonal palette which this music needs.</i> |
| piebald | A piebald horse. <i>A piebald horse.</i> |
| pie | Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>Pied daisies.</i> |
| pigment | Colour something with or as if with pigment. <i>Carotenoid pigments are red orange or yellow.</i> |
| pigmentation | Abnormal colouring of a person's skin, typically resulting from disease. |
| polychrome | Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Painters gilded and polychromed the wooden carvings.</i> |

| purple | Become purple. <i>Purple tyrant.</i> |
| red | A red light. <i>The company was 4 million in the red.</i> |
| roan | A roan animal. <i>A blue roan.</i> |
| smear | Stain by smearing or daubing with a dirty substance. <i>There was an oil smear on his jacket.</i> |
| spot | Make a spot or mark onto. <i>They changed his spot on the program.</i> |
| stain | Produce or leave stains. <i>The awful events would unfairly stain the city's reputation.</i> |
| stained | Marked or dyed or discolored with foreign matter. <i>A stained beer mat.</i> |
| tint | Dye someone's hair with a tint. <i>A tint of glamour.</i> |
| variegate | Change the appearance of, especially by marking with different colors. <i>The musicians variegate the pitch.</i> |
| white | The white part of an egg the nutritive and protective gelatinous substance surrounding the yolk consisting mainly of albumin dissolved in water. <i>Wide white margins.</i> |
