### Definitions of "Combines" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "combines" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Gather in a mass, sum, or whole.*
- *Join for a common purpose or in a common action.*
- *Add together from different sources.*
- *Combine so as to form a whole; mix.*
- *Put or add together.*
- *Mix together different elements.*
- *Have or possess in combination.*





## Synonyms of "Combines" as a verb (13 Words)

- aggregate** Amount in the aggregate to.  
*Socio occupational groups **aggregate** men sharing similar kinds of occupation.*
- blend** Blend or harmonize.  
***Blend** the nuts and raisins together.*
- coalesce** Combine (elements) in a mass or whole.  
*The puddles had **coalesced** into shallow streams.*
- commingle** Mix together different elements.  
*The part of the brain where the senses **commingle**.*
- compound** Make (something bad) worse; intensify the negative aspects of.  
*A dialect **compounded** of Spanish and Dutch.*
- conflate** Mix together different elements.  
*The urban crisis **conflates** a number of different economic political and social issues.*

<b>flux</b>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting.
<b>fuse</b>	Equip with a fuse provide with a fuse. <i>The two nuclei move together and <b>fuse</b> into one nucleus.</i>
<b>immix</b>	Mix together different elements.
<b>meld</b>	Lose its distinct outline or shape; blend gradually. <i>Australia s winemakers have <b>melded</b> modern science with traditional art.</i>
<b>merge</b>	Absorb (a title or estate) in another. <i>The cells <b>merge</b>.</i>
<b>mix</b>	Mix together different elements. <i>Peppercorns are sometimes <b>mixed</b> with other spices.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>The two Germanys officially <b>united</b>.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Combines" as a verb

- *These forces combined with others.*
- *Combine resources.*



## Associations of "Combines" (30 Words)

<b>alliance</b>	A formal agreement establishing an association or alliance between nations or other groups to achieve a particular aim. <i>A defensive <b>alliance</b> between Australia and New Zealand.</i>
<b>ally</b>	Become an ally or associate as by a treaty or marriage. <i>He was forced to dismiss his closest political <b>ally</b>.</i>
<b>amalgamate</b>	To bring or combine together or with something else. <i>Numerous small British railway companies <b>amalgamated</b>.</i>
<b>annex</b>	Add or attach as a condition or consequence. <i>Extreme anointing hath neither ordinance of God to be grounded on nor promise of grace <b>annexed</b>.</i>

<b>associate</b>	Having partial rights and privileges or subordinate status. <i>First was the lightning and then its thunderous <b>associate</b>.</i>
<b>coalesce</b>	Combine (elements) in a mass or whole. <i>The puddles had <b>coalesced</b> into shallow streams.</i>
<b>coalesced</b>	Joined together into a whole.
<b>coalescing</b>	Growing together, fusing.
<b>combination</b>	A sequence of numbers or letters that opens a combination lock. <i>The <b>combination</b> of recession and falling property values proved fatal to the business community.</i>
<b>combined</b>	Made or joined or united into one.
<b>commingle</b>	Mix; blend. <i>His book <b>commingles</b> sarcasm and sadness.</i>
<b>concerted</b>	Involving the joint activity of two or more. <i><b>Concerted</b> action.</i>
<b>confederacy</b>	A secret agreement between two or more people to perform an unlawful act. <i>The Italian <b>confederacy</b> known as the Lombard League.</i>
<b>conjoin</b>	Take in marriage. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>
<b>consolidate</b>	Combine (a number of things) into a single more effective or coherent whole. <i><b>Consolidate</b> one's hold on first place.</i>
<b>federate</b>	Relating to a federated state or organization. <i>The country was <b>federated</b> after the civil war.</i>
<b>fusion</b>	Correction of an unstable part of the spine by joining two or more vertebrae; usually done surgically but sometimes done by traction or immobilization. <i><b>Fusion</b> cuisine.</i>
<b>incorporate</b>	Make into a whole or make part of a whole. <i><b>Incorporate</b> this document with those pertaining to the same case.</i>
<b>incorporation</b>	Including by incorporating. <i>A law allowing <b>incorporation</b> as a company.</i>
<b>integrate</b>	Become one become integrated. <i>She was anxious to <b>integrate</b> well into her husband's family.</i>
<b>integration</b>	The action of incorporating a racial or religious group into a community. <i>Visuomotor <b>integration</b>.</i>

<b>join</b>	Cause to become joined or linked. <i>The two roads <b>join</b> here.</i>
<b><u>meld</u></b>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>Australia's winemakers have <b>melded</b> modern science with traditional art.</i>
<b><u>merge</u></b>	Combine or cause to combine to form a single entity. <i>We <b>merged</b> our resources.</i>
<b>reunify</b>	Unify again, as of a country. <i>Will Korea <b>reunify</b>.</i>
<b>synthesis</b>	Reasoning from the general to the particular (or from cause to effect). <i>The <b>synthesis</b> of methanol from carbon monoxide and hydrogen.</i>
<b><u>unify</u></b>	Become one. <i>Opposition groups struggling to <b>unify</b> around the goal of replacing the regime.</i>
<b><u>union</u></b>	A part of a flag with an emblem symbolizing national union typically occupying the upper corner next to the staff. <i>A currency <b>union</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>They are <b>united</b> by their love of cars.</i>
<b><u>united</u></b>	Joined together politically, for a common purpose, or by common feelings. <i>Women acting together in a <b>united</b> way.</i>
