## Associations of "Come across" (30 Words)

<b>along</b>	Used to refer to the passage of time or the making of progress. <i>Move <b>along</b>.</i>
<b>antipodal</b>	Relating to or denoting cells formed at the chalazal end of the embryo sac. <i><b>Antipodal</b> regions of the earth.</i>
<b>arrive</b>	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>We will be in touch with them when the time <b>arrives</b>.</i>
<b>ashore</b>	To or on the shore or land from the direction of the sea. <i>We spent the day <b>ashore</b>.</i>
<a href="#">bridge</a>	The central part of a pair of glasses fitting over the bridge of the nose. <i>His letters provided a <b>bridge</b> across the centuries.</i>
<b>circumambulate</b>	Walk around something. <i>They used to <b>circumambulate</b> the perimeter wall.</i>
<a href="#">cross</a>	Pass the ball across the field towards the centre when attacking. <i>She has <b>crossed</b> the Atlantic twice.</i>
<b>drawbridge</b>	A bridge that can be raised to block passage or to allow boats or ships to pass beneath it. <i>There was a rattle of chains as the <b>drawbridge</b> was lowered.</i>
<b>escalator</b>	A moving staircase consisting of an endlessly circulating belt of steps driven by a motor, which conveys people between the floors of a public building.
<b>go</b>	Go through in search of something search through someone s belongings in an unauthorized way. <i>Come on Tony it s your <b>go</b>.</i>
<a href="#">here</a>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>What are we all doing <b>here</b>.</i>

<b>horizon</b>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>The upper <b>horizon</b> of the site showed an arrangement of two rows of features.</i>
<b>immigrate</b>	Come to live permanently in a foreign country. <i>An Australian who <b>immigrated</b> to Britain in 1982.</i>
<b>landing</b>	The act of coming down to the earth (or other surface). <i>The D Day <b>landings</b>.</i>
<b>other</b>	Denoting a person or thing that is different or distinct from one already mentioned or known about. <i>This is our last resort there s no <b>other</b> way of reaching an agreement.</i>
<b>overpass</b>	A bridge by which a road or railway line passes over another. <i>Did not its sublimity <b>overpass</b> a little the bounds of the ridiculous.</i>
<b>pass</b>	Pass by. <i>Things came to such a <b>pass</b> that these gentlemen sat coldly at the meetings not daring to speak out freely and honestly.</i>
<b>path</b>	A line or route along which something travels or moves. <i>Genius usually follows a revolutionary <b>path</b>.</i>
<b>pedestrian</b>	A person walking rather than travelling in a vehicle. <i>The road is so dangerous <b>pedestrians</b> avoid it.</i>
<b>racetrack</b>	A racecourse.
<b>railway</b>	A set of tracks for other vehicles. <i>A <b>railway</b> line.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	Go back over (the same route that one has just taken). <i>We <b>retraced</b> the route we took last summer.</i>
<b>road</b>	A railroad. <i>Clara had to walk in the <b>road</b> to avoid black plastic rubbish sacks.</i>
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>The many <b>routes</b> to a healthier diet will be described.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A set of stairs and the rooms leading off it in a large building, especially a school or college. <i>A mirrored <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>station</b>	A bus or coach station. <i>Married above her <b>station</b>.</i>
<b>track</b>	The act of participating in an athletic competition involving running on a track. <i>The undercarriage was fully retractable inwards into the wing with a 90 inch <b>track</b>.</i>

**transverse** Extending or lying across; in a crosswise direction; at right angles to the long axis.

***Transverse** colon.*

**traverse** An area of land surveyed with a traverse.

*There were three jewels in the **traverse** of the cross and four in the body.*

**walkway** A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
