<b>back</b>	Of or at the back of something. <i>The team was five points <b>back</b>.</i>
<b>by</b>	So as to go past. <i>He let only a moment go <b>by</b>.</i>
<b>comer</b>	Someone who arrives (or has arrived). <i>Many in the party see tax relief as a <b>comer</b>.</i>
<b>exhale</b>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>She sat back and <b>exhaled</b> deeply.</i>
<b>facade</b>	The face or front of a building. <i>The house has a half timbered <b>facade</b>.</i>
<b>facing</b>	A protective covering that protects the outside of a building. <i>The bricks were used as a <b>facing</b> on a concrete core.</i>
<b>follow</b>	Follow with the eyes or the mind. <i>He <b>followed</b> his lecture with a question and answer period.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>His lying really <b>gets</b> me.</i>
<b>here</b>	In or at this place where the speaker or writer is. <i>Is everyone <b>here</b>.</i>

<b>home</b>	Return home accurately from a long distance. <i>Pigeons who do not <b>home</b> will win no prizes.</i>
<b>landing</b>	An instance of coming or bringing something to land, either from the air or from water. <i>The D Day <b>landings</b>.</i>
<b>location</b>	The act of putting something in a certain place. <i>The movie was filmed entirely on <b>location</b>.</i>
<b>look</b>	Of a building or room have an outlook in a specified direction. <i>The room <b>looks</b> out over Mylor Harbour.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Prevent from being included or considered or accepted. <i>He modestly <b>omits</b> to mention that he was a pole vault champion.</i>
<b>outward</b>	Outwards. <i>An <b>outward</b> display of friendliness.</i>
<b>reach</b>	Reach a goal e.g. <i>Government <b>reaches</b> out to the people.</i>
<b>recover</b>	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>Many companies <b>recovered</b> their costs within six months.</i>
<u>restitution</u>	A sum of money paid in compensation for loss or injury. <i>Upon the <b>restitution</b> of the book to its rightful owner the child was given a tongue lashing.</i>
<b>restoration</b>	The restoration of the Bourbon monarchy in France in 1814 following the fall of Napoleon Louis XVIII was recalled from exile by Talleyrand. <i>The altar paintings seem in need of <b>restoration</b>.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	To go back over again. <i>I've tried to <b>retrace</b> some of her movements.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>The investigation was completed after the <b>retrieval</b> of plane wreckage.</i>
<b>return</b>	The key on electric typewriters or computer keyboards that causes a carriage return and a line feed. <i>They set out on their <b>return</b> to the base camp.</i>
<u>trace</u>	Discover traces of. <i>Through the binoculars I <b>traced</b> the path I had taken the night before.</i>
<b>track</b>	Of wheels run so that the back ones are exactly in the track of the front ones. <i>The pickup's stylus must faithfully <b>track</b> undulations.</i>
<b>unprepossessing</b>	Not attractive or appealing to the eye. <i>Despite his <b>unprepossessing</b> appearance he had an animal magnetism.</i>
