| along | In accompaniment or as a companion. <i>She was thrilled to be along for the ride.</i> |
| arrive | Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>He still has to pinch himself to be sure he really has arrived.</i> |
| back | Walk or drive backwards. <i>She walked away without looking back.</i> |
| backslide | Relapse into bad ways or error. <i>There are many things that can cause slimmers to backslide.</i> |
| get | Take vengeance on or get even. <i>She didn't get the joke.</i> |
| here | Being here now. <i>I'm here to help you.</i> |
| immigrate | Come to live permanently in a foreign country. <i>An Australian who immigrated to Britain in 1982.</i> |
| landing | The act of coming to land after a voyage. <i>The plane made a smooth landing.</i> |
| occur | Come to pass. <i>Nothing occurred that seemed important.</i> |
| reach | Reach a goal e.g. <i>He seeks opportunities to reach viewers without journalistic interference.</i> |
| recover | Get or find back recover the use of. <i>Police recovered a stolen video.</i> |
| recovery | An object or amount of money recovered. <i>I have my heel below the pedal during the power stroke and above it during recovery.</i> |

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| recuperate | Restore to good health or strength. <i>The company managed to recuperate.</i> |
| recurring | Coming back. <i>Gratitude is a recurring theme in the book.</i> |
| reelect | Elect again. |
| regain | Get or find back; recover the use of. <i>She regained control of herself.</i> |
| repay | Make repayment for or return something. <i>Most of his fortune had been spent repaying creditors.</i> |
| resilience | The ability of a substance or object to spring back into shape; elasticity. <i>Nylon is excellent in wearability abrasion resistance and resilience.</i> |
| restitution | Recompense for injury or loss. <i>Restitution of the damaged mucosa.</i> |
| restoration | The restoration of the Bourbon monarchy in France in 1814 following the fall of Napoleon Louis XVIII was recalled from exile by Talleyrand. <i>Published restorations are dodgy based on single bones.</i> |
| restore | Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>Order was eventually restored by riot police.</i> |
| retrace | Go back over (the same route that one has just taken). <i>I ve tried to retrace some of her movements.</i> |
| retrieval | The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>My retrieval of people s names is very poor.</i> |
| retrieve | Reel or bring in a fishing line. <i>Retrieve the car from the parking garage.</i> |
| return | The key on electric typewriters or computer keyboards that causes a carriage return and a line feed. <i>The return of spring.</i> |
| revert | (of property) return to (the original owner) by reversion. <i>If interested kindly revert with your updated resume.</i> |
| staircase | A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>He descended the broad staircase.</i> |
| trace | Discover traces of. <i>The archeologist traced the hieroglyphs.</i> |
| track | The soundtrack of a film or video. <i>The title track of the album.</i> |
