<b>again</b>	Anew. <i>It was great to meet old friends <b>again</b>.</i>
<b>along</b>	In accompaniment or as a companion. <i>She was thrilled to be <b>along</b> for the ride.</i>
<b>arrive</b>	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>He still has to pinch himself to be sure he really has <b>arrived</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">back</a></b>	Walk or drive backwards. <i>She walked away without looking <b>back</b>.</i>
<b>backslide</b>	Relapse into bad ways or error. <i>There are many things that can cause slimmers to <b>backslide</b>.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>She didn't <b>get</b> the joke.</i>
<b><a href="#">here</a></b>	Being here now. <i>I'm <b>here</b> to help you.</i>
<b>immigrate</b>	Come to live permanently in a foreign country. <i>An Australian who <b>immigrated</b> to Britain in 1982.</i>
<b>landing</b>	The act of coming to land after a voyage. <i>The plane made a smooth <b>landing</b>.</i>
<b>occur</b>	Come to pass. <i>Nothing <b>occurred</b> that seemed important.</i>
<b>reach</b>	Reach a goal e.g. <i>He seeks opportunities to <b>reach</b> viewers without journalistic interference.</i>
<b>recover</b>	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>Police <b>recovered</b> a stolen video.</i>
<b>recovery</b>	An object or amount of money recovered. <i>I have my heel below the pedal during the power stroke and above it during <b>recovery</b>.</i>

<b>recuperate</b>	Restore to good health or strength. <i>The company managed to <b>recuperate</b>.</i>
<b>recurring</b>	Coming back. <i>Gratitude is a <b>recurring</b> theme in the book.</i>
<b>reelect</b>	Elect again.
<b>regain</b>	Get or find back; recover the use of. <i>She <b>regained</b> control of herself.</i>
<b>repay</b>	Make repayment for or return something. <i>Most of his fortune had been spent <b>repaying</b> creditors.</i>
<b>resilience</b>	The ability of a substance or object to spring back into shape; elasticity. <i>Nylon is excellent in wearability abrasion resistance and <b>resilience</b>.</i>
<b>restitution</b>	Recompense for injury or loss. <i><b>Restitution</b> of the damaged mucosa.</i>
<b>restoration</b>	The restoration of the Bourbon monarchy in France in 1814 following the fall of Napoleon Louis XVIII was recalled from exile by Talleyrand. <i>Published <b>restorations</b> are dodgy based on single bones.</i>
<b>restore</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>Order was eventually <b>restored</b> by riot police.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	Go back over (the same route that one has just taken). <i>I ve tried to <b>retrace</b> some of her movements.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>My <b>retrieval</b> of people s names is very poor.</i>
<b>retrieve</b>	Reel or bring in a fishing line. <i><b>Retrieve</b> the car from the parking garage.</i>
<b>return</b>	The key on electric typewriters or computer keyboards that causes a carriage return and a line feed. <i>The <b>return</b> of spring.</i>
<b>revert</b>	(of property) return to (the original owner) by reversion. <i>If interested kindly <b>revert</b> with your updated resume.</i>
<b>staircase</b>	A way of access (upward and downward) consisting of a set of steps. <i>He descended the broad <b>staircase</b>.</i>
<b>trace</b>	Discover traces of. <i>The archeologist <b>traced</b> the hieroglyphs.</i>
<b>track</b>	The soundtrack of a film or video. <i>The title <b>track</b> of the album.</i>
