- The opportunity to seek redress.
- A sheep bred from cross-bred and pure-bred parents for both wool and meat.
- A quick reply to a question or remark (especially a witty or critical one.

A pleading made by a defendant in response to the plaintiff's replication.

repayment An amount of money paid back.

Minimum monthly repayments

Minimum monthly **repayments**.

The repetition of an experiment in order to test the validity of its

conclusion.

replication
On its own replication does not validate a theory derived from

experimental results.

restitution The restoration of something to its original state.

He was ordered to pay 6 000 in **restitution**.

An increase or revival after a period of little activity, popularity, or

resurgence occurrence.

A **resurgence** of interest in religion.

The action of returning a military attack; counter-attack.

retaliation She rejected as preposterous any suggestion that she had acted in

retaliation.



retort A quick reply to a question or remark (especially a witty or critical one.

She opened her mouth to make a suitably cutting **retort**.

return A good rate of return.

On his **return** from Australia we gave him a welcoming party.

An improvement in the condition, strength, or fortunes of someone or

revival something.

Cross country skiing is enjoying a **revival**.

riposte A quick reply to a question or remark (especially a witty or critical one.

sally A sudden charge out of a besieged place against the enemy; a sortie.

The garrison there made a **sally** against us.

upturn An upward movement or trend as in business activity.

An **upturn** in the economy.
