Roosevelt was a **captivating** speaker.

charismatic Relating to the charismatic movement in the Christian Church.

Charismatic prophecy.

charming Pleasing or delighting.

A **charming** country cottage.

comme il faut According with custom or propriety.

decorous In keeping with good taste and propriety; polite and restrained.

Charlotte gave David a decorous kiss.

delightful Causing delight; charming.

A **delightful** surprise.

enchantingDelightfully charming or attractive.

Dinah looked **enchanting**.

fair (used of hair or skin) pale or light-colored.

fetching Attractive.

gorgeous

Beautiful; very attractive.

The weather was **gorgeous**.

handsome Given or giving freely.

A **handsome** allowance.

Too attractive and tempting to be resisted.

Irresistible beauty.

lovely Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye.

Lovely views.

prepossessing He was not a proposage in a sight.

He was not a **prepossessing** sight.

(used ironically) unexpectedly bad.

A **pretty** summer dress.

seemly Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous.

Seemly behavior.



sightly Very pleasing to the eye.

Metal guards can also be used but are less **sightly**.

Attracting attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent.

It is **striking** that no research into the problem is being carried out.

Extremely impressive or attractive.

stunning A stunning defeat.

winning Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition.

A **winning** smile.
