<b>appealing</b>	(of characters in literature or drama) evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>He added an <b>appealing</b> and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
<b>arresting</b>	Commanding attention. <i>At 6 feet 6 inches he was an <b>arresting</b> figure.</i>
<b>attractive</b>	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i><b>Attractive</b> clothes.</i>
<b>beautiful</b>	Highly enjoyable. <i><b>Beautiful</b> poetry.</i>
<b>becoming</b>	Suitable or appropriate. <i>A <b>becoming</b> portrait.</i>
<b>beguiling</b>	Misleading by means of pleasant or alluring methods. <i>The voice was low and <b>beguiling</b>.</i>
<b>bewitching</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A <b>bewitching</b> debut album.</i>
<b>bonnie</b>	Very pleasing to the eye.

<b>bonny</b>	(of a baby) plump and healthy-looking. <i>It s worth a thousand pounds a <b>bonny</b> sum.</i>
<b>captivating</b>	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Roosevelt was a <b>captivating</b> speaker.</i>
<b>charismatic</b>	Relating to the charismatic movement in the Christian Church. <i><b>Charismatic</b> prophecy.</i>
<b>charming</b>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>A <b>charming</b> country cottage.</i>
<b>comme il faut</b>	According with custom or propriety.
<b>decorous</b>	In keeping with good taste and propriety; polite and restrained. <i>Charlotte gave David a <b>decorous</b> kiss.</i>
<b>delightful</b>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A <b>delightful</b> surprise.</i>
<b>enchancing</b>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked <b>enchancing</b>.</i>
<b>engaging</b>	Charming and attractive. <i>An <b>engaging</b> smile.</i>
<b>fair</b>	(used of hair or skin) pale or light-colored. <i>He hit a <b>fair</b> ball over the third base bag.</i>
<b>fetching</b>	Attractive. <i>A <b>fetching</b> little garment of pink satin.</i>
<b>good-looking</b>	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- Thackeray.
<b>gorgeous</b>	Beautiful; very attractive. <i>The weather was <b>gorgeous</b>.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	Given or giving freely. <i>A <b>handsome</b> allowance.</i>
<b>irresistible</b>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i><b>Irresistible</b> beauty.</i>
<b>lovely</b>	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. <i><b>Lovely</b> views.</i>
<b>prepossessing</b>	Attractive or appealing in appearance. <i>He was not a <b>prepossessing</b> sight.</i>
<b>pretty</b>	(used ironically) unexpectedly bad. <i>A <b>pretty</b> summer dress.</i>
<b>seemly</b>	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i><b>Seemly</b> behavior.</i>

<b>sightly</b>	Very pleasing to the eye. <i>Metal guards can also be used but are less <b>sightly</b>.</i>
<b>striking</b>	Attracting attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>It is <b>striking</b> that no research into the problem is being carried out.</i>
<b>stunning</b>	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A <b>stunning</b> defeat.</i>
<b>winning</b>	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A <b>winning</b> smile.</i>

- appearance** Outward or visible aspect of a person or thing.  
*They try to keep up **appearances**.*
- attractive** Relating to attraction between physical objects.  
*Foliage can be as **attractive** as flowers.*
- beautiful** Pleasing the senses or mind aesthetically.  
*A **beautiful** young woman.*
- beauty** Denoting something intended to make someone more attractive.  
*The **beauty** of keeping cats is that they don't tie you down.*
- becoming** (of clothing) looking good on someone.  
*A **becoming** portrait.*
- belle** A young woman who is the most charming and beautiful of several rivals.  
*She was the **belle** of the ball.*

<b><u>charming</u></b>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>A <b>charming</b> personality.</i>
<b><u>chivalrous</u></b>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour). <i>Shall I be <b>chivalrous</b> and offer you my coat.</i>
<b>comeliness</b>	The quality of being good looking and attractive.
<b>cute</b>	Attractive in a pretty or endearing way. <i>A <b>cute</b> kid with pigtails.</i>
<b>dame</b>	Informal terms for a (young) woman. <i>A rich <b>dame</b> who took her husband to the cleaners.</i>
<b><u>decent</u></b>	Decently clothed. <i>Though one of her shoulder straps had slipped down she was perfectly <b>decent</b> by current standards.</i>
<b>decorous</b>	According with custom or propriety. <i>The tete a tete was <b>decorous</b> in the extreme.</i>
<b>enchantingly</b>	In a bewitching manner.
<b>gaily</b>	In a gay manner. <i>He waved <b>gaily</b> to the crowd.</i>
<b>gorgeous</b>	Dazzlingly beautiful. <i>The weather was <b>gorgeous</b>.</i>
<b><u>gracious</u></b>	(in Christian belief) showing divine grace. <i>He bears insult with <b>gracious</b> good humor.</i>
<b>handsome</b>	(of a thing) well made, imposing, and of obvious quality. <i><b>Handsome</b> cookery books.</i>
<b>lyrical</b>	(of literature, art, or music) expressing the writer's emotions in an imaginative and beautiful way. <i>The <b>lyrical</b> content of his songs.</i>
<b>ma'am</b>	A woman of refinement.
<b>maiden</b>	An over in which no runs are scored. <i>Two knights fought to win the hand of a fair <b>maiden</b>.</i>
<b><u>picturesque</u></b>	Suggesting or suitable for a picture; pretty as a picture. <i>Ruined abbeys and <b>picturesque</b> villages.</i>
<b><u>pretty</u></b>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>It was a <b>pretty</b> bad injury.</i>
<b><u>ravishing</u></b>	Delightful; entrancing. <i>A <b>ravishing</b> blonde.</i>
<b>recherche</b>	Lavishly elegant and refined.

- resplendent** Having great beauty and splendor.  
*She was **resplendent** in a sea green dress.*
- seemly** Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous.  
*I felt it was not **seemly** to observe too closely.*
- strikingly** In a striking manner.  
*Their methods of work differed **strikingly**.*
- stunning** Commanding attention.  
*She looked **stunning**.*
- sylph** An imaginary spirit of the air.  
*An oh so slim **sylph** dressed in a black leotard.*
