appealing	<i>He added an appealing and memorable figure to popular American mythology.</i>
arresting	Commanding attention. <i>At 6 feet 6 inches he was an arresting figure.</i>
attractive	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i>Attractive clothes.</i>
beautiful	Highly enjoyable. <i>Beautiful poetry.</i>
becoming	Suitable or appropriate. <i>A becoming portrait.</i>
beguiling	Misleading by means of pleasant or alluring methods. <i>The voice was low and beguiling.</i>
bewitching	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>A bewitching debut album.</i>
bonnie	Very pleasing to the eye.

bonny	(of a baby) plump and healthy-looking. <i>It s worth a thousand pounds a bonny sum.</i>
captivating	Capturing interest as if by a spell. <i>Roosevelt was a captivating speaker.</i>
<u>charismatic</u>	Relating to the charismatic movement in the Christian Church. Charismatic prophecy.
<u>charming</u>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>A charming country cottage.</i>
comme il faut	According with custom or propriety.
decorous	In keeping with good taste and propriety; polite and restrained. <i>Charlotte gave David a decorous kiss.</i>
<u>delightful</u>	Causing delight; charming. <i>A delightful surprise.</i>
<u>enchancing</u>	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Dinah looked enchancing.</i>
engaging	Charming and attractive. <i>An engaging smile.</i>
fair	(used of hair or skin) pale or light-colored. <i>He hit a fair ball over the third base bag.</i>
fetching	Attractive. <i>A fetching little garment of pink satin.</i>
good-looking	Pleasing in appearance especially by reason of conformity to ideals of form and proportion- Thackeray.
gorgeous	Beautiful; very attractive. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
handsome	Given or giving freely. <i>A handsome allowance.</i>
<u>irresistible</u>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. Irresistible beauty.
lovely	Appealing to the emotions as well as the eye. Lovely views.
prepossessing	Attractive or appealing in appearance. <i>He was not a prepossessing sight.</i>
<u>pretty</u>	(used ironically) unexpectedly bad. <i>A pretty summer dress.</i>
seemly	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. Seemly behavior.

sightly	Very pleasing to the eye. <i>Metal guards can also be used but are less sightly.</i>
striking	Attracting attention by reason of being unusual, extreme, or prominent. <i>It is striking that no research into the problem is being carried out.</i>
stunning	Extremely impressive or attractive. <i>A stunning defeat.</i>
winning	Gaining, resulting in, or relating to victory in a contest or competition. <i>A winning smile.</i>

Associations of "Comely" (30 Words)

appearance	Outward or visible aspect of a person or thing. <i>They try to keep up appearances.</i>
attractive	Relating to attraction between physical objects. <i>Foliage can be as attractive as flowers.</i>
beautiful	Pleasing the senses or mind aesthetically. <i>A beautiful young woman.</i>
beauty	Denoting something intended to make someone more attractive. <i>The beauty of keeping cats is that they don't tie you down.</i>
<u>becoming</u>	(of clothing) looking good on someone. <i>A becoming portrait.</i>
belle	A young woman who is the most charming and beautiful of several rivals. <i>She was the belle of the ball.</i>

<u>charming</u>	Pleasing or delighting. <i>A charming personality.</i>
<u>chivalrous</u>	Courteous and gallant, especially towards women (typically used of a man or his behaviour). <i>Shall I be chivalrous and offer you my coat.</i>
comeliness	The quality of being good looking and attractive.
cute	Attractive in a pretty or endearing way. <i>A cute kid with pigtails.</i>
dame	Informal terms for a (young) woman. <i>A rich dame who took her husband to the cleaners.</i>
<u>decent</u>	Decently clothed. <i>Though one of her shoulder straps had slipped down she was perfectly decent by current standards.</i>
decorous	According with custom or propriety. <i>The tete a tete was decorous in the extreme.</i>
enchantingly	In a bewitching manner.
gaily	In a gay manner. <i>He waved gaily to the crowd.</i>
gorgeous	Dazzlingly beautiful. <i>The weather was gorgeous.</i>
<u>gracious</u>	(in Christian belief) showing divine grace. <i>He bears insult with gracious good humor.</i>
handsome	(of a thing) well made, imposing, and of obvious quality. <i>Handsome cookery books.</i>
lyrical	(of literature, art, or music) expressing the writer's emotions in an imaginative and beautiful way. <i>The lyrical content of his songs.</i>
ma'am	A woman of refinement.
maiden	An over in which no runs are scored. <i>Two knights fought to win the hand of a fair maiden.</i>
<u>picturesque</u>	Suggesting or suitable for a picture; pretty as a picture. <i>Ruined abbeys and picturesque villages.</i>
<u>pretty</u>	Make pretty or attractive. <i>It was a pretty bad injury.</i>
<u>ravishing</u>	Delightful; entrancing. <i>A ravishing blonde.</i>
recherche	Lavishly elegant and refined.

resplendent	Having great beauty and splendor. <i>She was resplendent in a sea green dress.</i>
seemly	Conforming to accepted notions of propriety or good taste; decorous. <i>I felt it was not seemly to observe too closely.</i>
strikingly	In a striking manner. <i>Their methods of work differed strikingly.</i>
stunning	Commanding attention. <i>She looked stunning.</i>
sylph	An imaginary spirit of the air. <i>An oh so slim sylph dressed in a black leotard.</i>
